## FY22 at a Glance



**1,610** incarcerated individuals work at CI as of 6/30/22.

---

CI incarcerated participants worked a total of **218,335** programming hours.

---

**155** employment based certifications issued to CI incarcerated participants.

---

CI contributed **\$46.2M** to the Washington State economy through purchases from local suppliers and staff salaries.

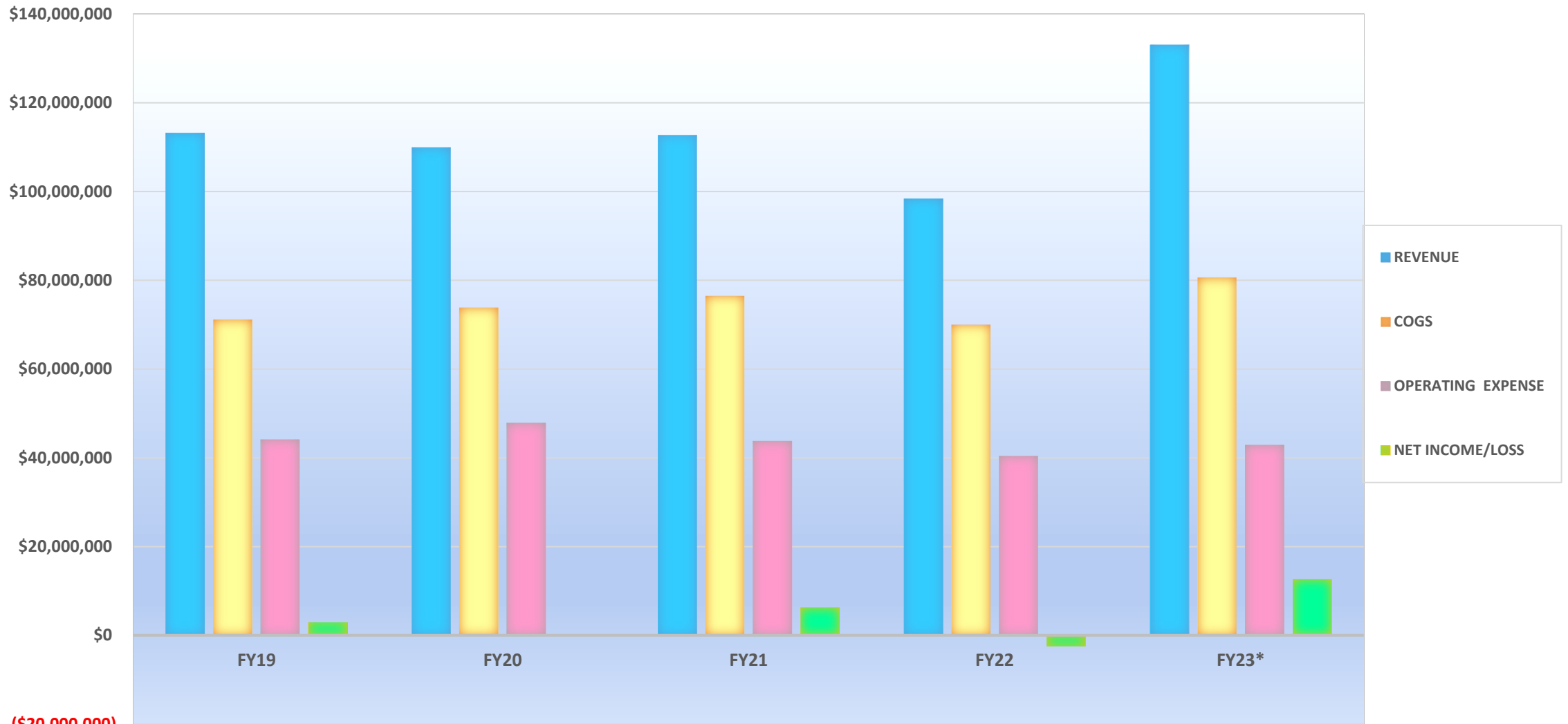

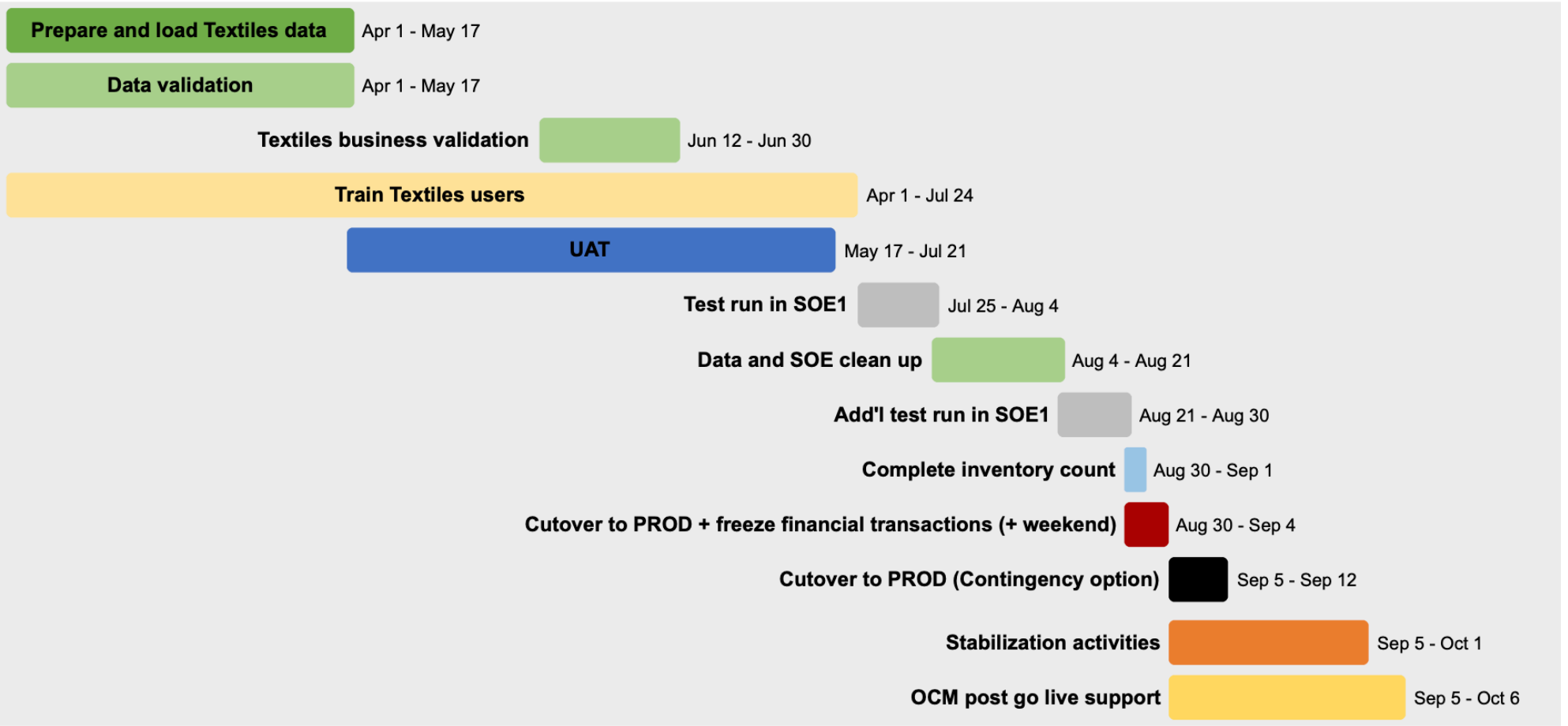
