- An updated prosecutor recommendation was not received.

- Mr. Bockman was seen for a .100 Hearing on December 19, 2017 at the Airway Heights Corrections Center.

- **Summary Discussion**
Ms. Rongen presented this case.

Mr. Bockman is under the jurisdiction of the Board in King County Cause 81-1-00378-4 for Murder in the First Degree.

The description of the underlying offense included Mr. Bockman, his brother and another co-defendant murdering a 91 year old woman whose home they were burglarizing by beating and stabbing her to death. The same evening of the murder the same three burglarized a dental office in the neighborhood and then fought with police when they arrived on the scene. Mr. Bockman was 22 years old at the time of the crimes and is currently 58 years of age.

Mr. Bockman has an extensive criminal history starting when he was 12 years old to include Trespassing, Vandalism, Auto Theft, Purse Snatching, Assault Second Degree, Burglary Second Degree and several misdemeanor offenses.

Mr. Bockman has a conviction for Child Molestation 2 conviction which he committed while on parole. He was self-medicating with alcohol during this crime. He received 41 months for this conviction which runs consecutively to the murder.

Risk assessment scores rate him as a moderate to high risk to re-offend. He has completed has completed the Sex Offender Treatment and Assessment Program (SOTAP) since those risk assessment instruments were used. It was reported that he did well in treatment.

Mr. Bockman has had no infractions during this current incarceration.

In addition to completion of SOTAP, Mr. Bockman has completed Thinking for a Change and Substance Abuse Out-Patient Treatment. He works as a sewing machine operator in textiles for which he receives superior ratings from his supervisor.

- **Recommendation:** Parolable to his consecutive OAA/CCP Grays Harbor County Cause 12-1-00352-4 for Child Molestation in the Second Degree.
Next action: Parole to OAA/CCB Cause.
