- An updated prosecutor recommendation was not received.

- Mr. Joe was seen for a release hearing at the Airway Heights Correction Center on December 19, 2017.

- **Summary Discussion**
Mrs. Ramsdell-Gilkey presented this case.

- Mr. Joe was reviewed by the Board for his conviction in Yakima County Cause 96-1-02018-0 for Murder in the First Degree.

The murder involved Mr. Joe shooting a known male in the back of the head at point blank range after both attended a party that evening. It was alleged that the victim owed Mr. Joe money for drugs. Mr. Joe was 17 years old at the time of the crime and is currently 37 years of age.

Mr. Joe has a significant juvenile criminal history to include Assault Second Degree in 1993 and 1994 as well as Burglary in the Second Degree. He also has convictions for several misdemeanor offenses.

Risk assessment scores rate him as a low to moderate risk to re-offend.

Mr. Joe has had 20 serious infractions in the last 20 years with one of the last one occurring in 2013 for threatening staff because he felt disrespected.

Programming: He has completed a good deal of programming. He has been in the Violence Reduction Unit since his last infraction and has made a commitment not to be violent. He has received his AA and is working toward his BA. Has completed Thinking for a Change.

He appears remorseful and finally admitted the offense to family and friends a couple of years ago.

Release Planning: Mr. Joe would like to release to his wife in Kansas, and she is also willing to move here. The Board would prefer Mr. Joe stay in WA State for his first year of supervision.

- **Recommendation:** Releasable on or about June 2019 after transition through lower leaves of custody.
- **Next action:** Submit an offender release plan for approval by the Board in February 2019.
