- Mr. Brooks was seen for a .100 Hearing on January 9, 2018 at the Monroe Correctional Complex – Twin Rivers Unit
  
- **Summary Discussion**  
Mr. Patnode presented this case.

Mr. Brooks is currently under the jurisdiction of the Board in Snohomish County Cause 78-1-00523-8 for Assault in the Second Degree. This crime involved Mr. Brooks, while in prison, approaching a Catholic nun asking her to pray with him because he was having sexual thoughts. During the prayer, Mt. Brook's pushed the nun to the grown causing her to hit her face. She began screaming and Mr. Brooks ran to an officer and turned himself in.

Mr. Brooks also has a conviction for Murder in the First Degree in Spokane County Cause 22582. He served the minimum term on this cause prior to being paroled to the consecutive Assault Second Degree in Snohomish County. The murder involved Mr. Brooks picking up a hitchhiker and driving her to down a dirt road rather than to her requested destination. His intent was to seduce the victim and changed his mind when he heard a motorcycle. He choked the victim, hit her in the head with a claw hammer and then cut her throat. Mr. Brooks was 20 years old at the time of this murder and he is currently 63 years of age.

Mr. Brooks also has consecutive Sentencing Reform Act (SRA) convictions for two counts of Custodial Assault in Spokane County Cause 00-1-00799-1.

Risk assessment scores rate him as a moderate risk to re-offend.

Mr. Brooks has several serious infractions with the last one occurring in 2017 for refusing to return to his cell.

Mr. Brooks completed Self Awareness and Bridges to Life in December of 2017. He is currently participating in Intensive Outpatient Program for chemical dependency as well as the Sex Offender Treatment and Assessment Program.

The Board is concerned that Mr. Brooks does not admit having any sexual thoughts during his Murder 1 and Assault 2 and previous juvenile history.

He does not have any community support.

- **Recommendation:** Not parolable, extend to maximum expiration date of July 31, 2021.

**Next Action:** Schedule Cashaw Hearing prior to maximum release date.
