Mrs. Ramsdell-Gilkey presented this case.

Risk assessment scores rate him as a moderate risk to re-offend.

Mr. Osborne is under the jurisdiction of the Board in Snohomish County Cause #82-1-00510-4 for Kidnapping in the First Degree Count I. This crime involved Mr. Osborne abducting an unknown four year old girl from an apartment complex playground and sexually assaulting her. There was a subsequent high speed chase with law enforcement which ended in the police shooting his tires and pinning his car against a telephone pole. Mr. Osborne was 30 years old at the time of the offense and is currently 65 years of age.

Mr. Osborne was also convicted and served time for Counts II, III, and IV on the instant offense for Assault 2, Malicious Mischief and Attempting to Elude Police Vehicle. These counts have reached their statutory maximum. Prior to the instant crime Mr. Osborne was convicted of Snohomish County Cause 79-1-00054-4 Indecent Liberties which has also reached its statutory maximum.

Mr. Osborne's last serious infraction was in 2007.

Mr. Osborne completed the Sex Offender Treatment and Assessment Program (SOTAP) on his third try. His progress was inconsistent. He is currently participating in chemical dependency treatment for a second time. He has held many jobs.

- **Recommendation:** The panel recommends that Mr. Osborne be found not parolable and that 60 months be added to his minimum term. Schedule .100 120 days prior to his parole eligibility review date (PERD).
