- **Summary Discussion**

Mr. Patnode presented this case.

Mr. Morgan was seen for a .100 Hearing on April 11, 2017 at the Stafford Creek Corrections Center.

Risk assessment scores rate him as low to moderate to re-offend.

Mr. Morgan is under the jurisdiction of the Board in King County Cause #83633 for Murder in the First Degree while armed with a deadly weapon.

The crime involved Mr. Morgan and a co-defendant robbing and killing a man from a local bar. He confessed to a priest that he had been a witness to the homicide and reports indicate he wrote a letter expressing his remorse for taking a life. When questioned by the police, he admitted his participation in the crime. He now denies that he actually killed the victim and indicated it was his co-defendant. Mr. Morgan was 22 years old at the time of the crime and is currently 61 years of age.

Mr. Morgan has had 18 total serious infractions with the last one occurring in 2006 for refusing cell assignment.

Due to Mr. Morgan's medical condition he has not completed much programming.

Mr. Morgan was previously found parolable to a Mutual Re-entry Plan (MRP), but wanted to choose where he transitioned. The Board informed him he does not get to dictate the conditions of his MRP.

- **Recommendation:** The panel recommends that he be found not parolable and 60 months be added to his minimum term. Schedule .100 Hearing 120 days prior to PERD.
