- **Summary Discussion**
Ms. Rongen presented this case.

Mr. Seymore's .100 Hearing was held on April 4, 2017 at the Monroe Correctional Complex – Twin Rivers Unit, he refused to attend and it was held in absentia

Risk assessment scores rate him as a low to moderate risk to re-offend.

Mr. Seymore is under the jurisdiction of the Board in Spokane County Cause #81-1-00824-1 for Attempted Murder in the First Degree. Mr. Seymore was originally charged with rape of a 14 year old girl at knifepoint in his own home. The day before the trial was to start the victim sustained a serious injury after jumping from a second story window during a house fire to save herself. Mr. Seymore accepted a plea agreement for Indecent Liberties and

was sent to Eastern State Hospital when it was discovered he was responsible for the house fire in an attempt to murder the victim so she could not testify against him. He was 27 years of age at the time of the crime and is currently 62 years of age.

Mr. Seymore has received only two serious infractions during his incarceration with the last one occurring in 1998.

Mr. Seymore is confined to a wheel chair and does not work, nor has he completed any programming since the Board last saw him in 2010. He has refused to complete the Sex Offender Treatment and Assessment Program (SOTAP) Aftercare, and this is the third hearing he has refused to attend. He has also refused to participate in a psychological evaluation.

He has no release plans and does not believe the Board will release him.

- **Recommendation:** The Panel recommends a finding of not parolable and adding 90 months to his minimum term. Schedule .100 120 days prior to parole eligibility review date (PERD). The Board requests a new psychological evaluation for next hearing.
