Ms. Rongen presented this case.

Mr. Paxton was seen for a .100 hearing at the Monroe Correctional Complex – Twin Rivers Unit on 5-3-2017.

Risk assessment scores rate him as a low to moderate risk to re-offend.

Mr. Paxton is under the jurisdiction of the Board in King County Cause #83-1-00335-7 for Rape in the First Degree Counts I and II and Burglary in the Second Degree Count III. Count III ran concurrent with Count I and II and reached its maximum expiration date on August 25 1993.

Mr. Paxton was on furlough from a Work Release Facility when he committed the two rapes and burglary. After consuming a large amount of alcohol, he

broke into a home occupied by two women. For an hour and a half he assaulted and raped the two women. They were severely traumatized.

He has previous convictions for Prowling, Grand Theft, AWOL, Speeding and a 1977 Burglary in the Second Degree. In 1980 he committed another Burglary in the Second Degree and was serving on this cause when he committed the current offenses.

He also had a previous arrest in California for Assault to Rape and Burglary which was pled to Battery. This involved stalking a woman that refused to date him and breaking into her apartment and attempting to rape her.

Mr. Paxton has had 11 infractions with the last one occurring in 1996.

Mr. Paxton completed the Sex Offender Treatment and Assessment Program (SOTAP) in 2003. He also completed Stress/Anger Management, SMART, and Non-Violent Communication, Alternatives to Violation, Moral Reconciliation Therapy and Victim Awareness. The Board wants him to re-take SOTAP.

Mr. Paxton refused to come to his hearing after requesting a continuance in December to review his psychological evaluation.

- **Recommendation:** The panel recommends finding him not parolable and adding 90 months to his minimum term.
  
- **Next action:** Schedule .100 120 days prior to his parole eligibility review date (PERD). If Mr. Paxton or his attorney have new information for the Board to consider prior to his next hearing, an earlier hearing may be considered, however this should be screened carefully since he was given two opportunities for a hearing.
