- **Summary Discussion**  
Ms. Kecia Rongen presented this case.

Mr. King was seen for a .100 Hearing at the Monroe Correctional Command – Twin Rivers Unit on May 2, 2017.

Risk assessment scores rate him as a moderate-high risk to re-offend sexually.

Mr. King is under the Board's jurisdiction for in Snohomish County Cause 81-1-00676-5 Rape in the First Degree. He has previously served on two other counts of Rape in the First Degree for this cause as well as two counts of Rape in the First Degree in King County Cause 8-1-102299-1.

The file material describes the King County Convictions to encompass victims aged 14 to 20 years of age who were female hitchhikers and unknown to Mr. King. The Snohomish County victims included two real estate agents showing homes as well as a third victim selling her own home. He has admitted to up to 55 victims, the majority of whom were described as prostitutes.

He has had one serious infraction with the last one occurring in 2005.

Mr. King completed the Western State Hospital Sexual Psychopath Program and then re-offended. He has completed the Sex Offender Treatment and Assessment Program and his progress was noted as "good."

Mr. King has been married for 44 years and would like to release to the House of Mercy.

He was found conditionally parolable at his last hearing in June of 2015. After that finding a Forensic Psychological Evaluation was completed and the findings were that he met criteria for civil commitment under RCW 71.09. At this time the Board is unable to find him parolable.

- **Recommendation:** The panel recommends that his conditional parolability be rescinded and he be found not parolable and that 90 months be added to his minimum term. Schedule a .100 Hearing 120 days prior to his parole eligibility review date.
