- The Spokane County Prosecutor's Office submitted a recommendation on April 11, 2017 in which they oppose any reduction in Mr. Bebb's sentence.
- **Hearing:** Mr. Bebb was seen at Rap House Work Release on May 11, 2017 for a .100 Parolability Hearing.
- **Summary Discussion**
Mr. Patnode presented this case.

Risk assessment scores rate him as moderate to high to re-offend. However, Mr. Bebb's risk is offset by multiple protective factors including his participation in a great deal of programming, he has a job and a place to live. All those things as well as his current age mitigate his risk.

Mr. Bebb is under the Board's jurisdiction in Spokane County Cause 82-1-00647-6 for Murder in the First Degree.

The crime involved Mr. Bebb shooting an unknown adult female during the course of an armed robbery. The victim was an attendant at the Password/Western Union Store where the robbery and murder occurred. Mr. Bebb has continues to state that he is not the gunmen, but will not provide names of any potential crime partners. He also states he is completely responsible for what happened. Mr. Bebb was 35 years old at the time of the offense and he is currently 73 years of age.

Mr. Bebb has a long criminal history dating back to January 1963 when he was convicted in California for auto theft when he was a juvenile. He has several other California convictions to include forgery, escape, armed robbery, driving under the Influence and assault with a deadly weapon. In addition, he has an Assault conviction in Oklahoma. He has several other felony arrests between 1958 and 1978 for which he did not receive convictions.

Mr. Bebb has incurred 14 total serious infractions during his incarceration with the last one in 2007 for tobacco use.

Mr. Bebb has been working on his Mutual Re-Entry Plan and has completed a variety of programs at camp. He was quick to secure employment shortly after arriving at work release and he has also secured housing. He has completed a long list of education and vocational courses as well as offender change programs.

Release planning: Mr. Bebb has a job as a chemical dependency counselor and has completed his AA Degree. He is working toward his counselor certification. He has secured housing through Lesta Rogers.

- **Recommendation:** The panel recommends that Mr. Bebb be found parolable and that he submit an offender release plan.
