- An updated prosecutor recommendation was not received in this case. However the sentencing judge recommended no release.
  
- Anthony Powers was seen for a release hearing at the Stafford Creek Correction Center on June 15, 2018.
  
- **Summary Discussion**  
Mrs. Ramsdell-Gilkey presented this case.

Mr. Powers is being seen by the Board per RCW 9.95.730 for Clark County Cause 93-1-01373-6 for Murder in the First Degree. This is Mr. Powers' second hearing with the Board. ON May 12, 2015 Mr. Powers was seen for his first release hearing and found not releasable. He was told he could re-petition in two years.

The crime involved Mr. Powers and his older brother being involved a series of offenses in the Vancouver, Washington area. All other charges were dropped and Mr. Powers and his brother were convicted of the murder of an 82 year old female in her home. They later tried to move her body to cover up the crime. They were arrested during this process. Mr. Powers was 16 years old at the time of the crime and he is currently 41 years of age.

Risk assessment scores rate him as a low to moderate risk to re-offend. However, he has characteristics of anti-social personality which may affect his future decisions.

Mr. Powers committed his last serious infraction in 2004.

Mr. Powers has completed any programming that has been available. He has been working on improving aspects of the Roots of Success Program and has been a long time facilitator of the program. He has also completed Getting it Right and Re-entry Life Skills. The Board would like him to complete Bridges to Life and Thinking for a change.

Mr. Powers acknowledged his responsibility for the murder as well as other offenses.

Mr. Powers would like to release to his fiancée in Walla Walla, Washington.

- **Recommendation:** The panel finds Mr. Powers not releasable.
- **Next Action:** Re-petition in 36 months. The Board would like him to complete Thinking for a Change.
