- Mr. Alishio was seen for a .100 Hearing on June 6, 2017 at the Monroe Correctional Command – Twin Rivers Unit.
  
- **Summary Discussion**  
Ms. Rongen presented this case.

Risk assessment scores rate him as an average to above average risk to re-offend, however, Dr. Phenix stated in her report “the associated absolute probabilities are quite low.”

Mr. Alishio is under the jurisdiction of the Board in King County Cause 80-1-02215-2 for Rape in the First Degree (While Armed with a Deadly Weapon) Count I which has a statutory maximum of Life, and Rape in the Second Degree Count III which has a statutory maximum of 10 years which has now expired.

Count I consisted of Mr. Alishio raping an unknown woman in her car while armed with knife after he provided her roadside assistance. Count III included Mr. Alishio raping an unknown woman who had been walking on a main highway. He was 25 years old at the time of these rapes and he is currently 62 years of age.

Mr. Alishio has a long criminal history that includes sex offenses as a juvenile and a sexually motivated Assault Second Degree when he was 18 years of age. At that time he was committed to the Sexual Psychopathy Program at Western State Hospital which he did not successfully complete.

Mr. Alishio has incurred 16 infractions overall, with the last one occurring in 2010. None of the infractions were sex related.

Mr. Alishio has completed the Sex Offender Treatment and Assessment Program (SOTAP) twice with the last time being in 2015. His progress was noted as significant. He has completed chemical dependency treatment as well.

Release planning: The Board would like him to work on a stronger release plan other than releasing to a MAC House or House of Mercy.

The Board had previously found him conditionally parolable and the End of Sentence Review Committee (ESRC) ordered a Forensic Psychological Evaluation (FPE). The FPE findings were that he did not meet criteria due to age and medical issues.

Mr. Alishio would like to go to the Crossroads Program at Monroe for transitioning through lower levels of custody.

- **Recommendation:** The panel recommends finding Mr. Alishio conditionally parolable to a Mutual Re-Entry Plan and adding 24 months to his minimum term. Schedule .100 120 days prior to his parole eligibility review date.
