- Mr. Bird was seen for a release hearing at the Washington Corrections Center on June 13, 2018.

- **Summary Discussion**
Ms. Rongen presented this case.

Mr. Bird is under review of the Board in Pierce County Cause 96-1-00512-8 for Assault in the First Degree; kidnapping in the First Degree; Assault in the Second Degree and Kidnapping in the First Degree.

The crimes involved Mr. Bird and his accomplices robbing, beating and abducting two males. The Female accomplices lured the two victims into the apartment where they were beaten with several objects and threatened with weapons. They were later placed in the trunk of their car where police found

them still alive. Mr. Bird was 16 at the time of the offense and he is currently 38 years of age.

Risk assessment scores rate low to moderate risk to re-offend.

Mr. Bird has over 60 serious infractions with the last violent one in 2011. A majority of infractions are for refusing cell assignment.

Mr. Bird has completed Thinking for a Change, Stress/Anger Management and a number of educational and work programs.

Mr. Bird was returned from work release pending infraction behavior in February 2018. Mr. Bird received an infraction for walking off his job and being unaccounted for in the community for five hours. He was found not guilty of this infraction and the Hearing Officer did not think this behavior was willful due to mental health issues. The Board cancelled his release and scheduled another release hearing.

Fare Start will accept him back and he has support from his Mom and Dad.

The Board would like him to become more stable and get his mental health issues under control before transitioning back out to the community.

- **Recommendation:** The panel finds Mr. Bird not releasable. The Board would like him to participate in Bridges to Life, mental health services and more educational programs.

Next Action: Re-petition in December of 2019.
