- An updated prosecutor recommendation was received in this case.
- Mr. Betournay was seen for a Juvenile Board Release Hearing on June 21, 2017 at the Monroe Correctional Center– Intensive Management Unit.
- **Summary Discussion**
Mr. Patnode presented this case.

Risk assessment scores rate him as a moderate to high risk to re-offend.

Mr. Betournay was seen for a release hearing by the ISRB in Walla Walla County Cause 95-1-00040-9 for two counts of Murder in the First Degree.

Mr. Betournay submitted a petition for review by the Board in 2014. He with-drew that petition stating he was not ready to see the Board. In 2016, he re-petitioned the Board for a hearing.

Mr. Betournay murdered two known 14 year old females by suffocation. He was 15 years old at the time of the crimes and he is currently 37 years of age.

Mr. Betournay has had 23 serious infractions. Several of his infractions are sexual in nature.

Mr. Betournay has been terminated from the Sex Offender Treatment and Assessment Program (SOTAP) twice. One termination involved sexual assault in 2011 to 2012. He was doing well in the program the second time prior to disclosing another sexual assault.

Mr. Betournay has participated in the following programs other than SOTAP. He has completed Thinking for a Change; Job Psychology; Vocational Writing and Re-entry Life Skills.

Mr. Betournay has no community support and has had no visitors. His risk to re-offend, unresolved mental health issues and lack of insight into his crime makes him a poor candidate for release.

- **Recommendation:** The panel recommends that Mr. Betournay be found not releasable. He can re-petition in June 2022.
