- An updated prosecutor recommendation was not received.
  
- Mr. Sattler was seen for a .100 hearing at the Washington State Penitentiary on July 24, 2018.
  
- **Summary Discussion**  
Mrs. Ramsdell-Gilkey presented this case.

Mr. Sattler is under the Board's jurisdiction in King county Cause 52990 for Murder in the First Degree.

Mr. Sattler was paroled on July 29, 2013 and on June 3, 2015, his parole was revoked and he was returned to prison. He was thrown out of three different living situations due to non-compliance with the rules of the facilities. An alternative placement could not be found.

The crime involved Mr. Sattler coming to Washington to look for work. He called relatives looking for a place to stay which they were not able to accommodate. He took a room in a hotel and invited a family member out to dinner. When they returned to his hotel room, he shot the victim eight times which resulted in his death.

Risk assessment scores rate Mr. Sattler as a moderate risk to re-offend.

Mr. Sattler incurred seven infractions since his last hearing and prior to his move to the health services building at the Penitentiary. His infractions include verbal threats to staff and not keeping up on his hygiene. He says he would not follow through on the verbal threats.

Mr. Sattler has not participated in any programming and he is not able to take care of himself.

- **Decision:**
  - The full Board finds him not parolable and adds 30 months to his minimum term.
  
- **Reasons:**
  - **Has incurred 7 additional serious infractions since last hearing**
  - **Has not participated on programming**
  - **Struggles with activities of daily living**
  
- **Next Action:**
  - Schedule .100 120 days prior to parole eligibility review date (PERD). **The Board would like to see Mr. Sattler transferred to an appropriate DOC facility with medical care on the west side of the state as soon as possible.**
  
- **Recommendations:**
  - Mr. Sattler will need to work with staff and likely DSHS to begin planning for his eventual release to a community setting. Any community based facility willing to consider Mr. Sattler will most likely want to meet with him in person prior to final acceptance.
