- An updated recommendation was received by King County Prosecutor recommending Ms. Washington be given an opportunity for release.
- Ms. Washington was seen for a Release Hearing on August 16, 2017 at the Washington Corrections Center for Women.
- **Summary Discussion**
Kecia Rongen presented this case.

Ms. Washington is being reviewed by the Board for her convictions in King County Cause 96-1-07233-4 for Rape in the First Degree Count IV. She also has convictions for Murder in the First Degree Count I and Robbery in the First Degree Counts II and III. Counts I, II and III are concurrent and Count IV is consecutive to these three counts.

The crime involved Ms. Washington contacting the victim with whom she was previously involved in a romantic relationship. She asked him to meet

her at a hotel. Once there, her three male co-defendants came out of the bathroom and assaulted and raped the victim. Ms. Washington participated in the rape.

The Murder in Count I involved Ms. Washington calling the victim to pick her up at the hotel where she was staying. The co-defendant followed Ms. Washington and the victim to the victim's house where he was robbed and shot. The two robberies involved the same type of behavior which included Ms. Washington calling the victims to get together. The victims were robbed at gunpoint. Ms. Washington was 17 years of age at the time of these crimes and is currently 38 years of age.

Risk assessment scores rate her as a low risk to re-offend.

Ms. Washington has had a total of twenty infractions during her incarceration with the last one occurring in 2010 for fighting. She completely turned around in 2011 and has had no infractions since that time.

Ms. Washington has completed Getting in Right; Moral Reconciliation Therapy, Sex Offender Treatment and Assessment Program (SOTAP), chemical dependency, Re-entry Life Skills, Moving On, Victim Awareness,, Keeping the Fair, Peer Support, Re-entry Employment Training, Facilitating Re-entry and IF Project Self Care. She has also completed numerous vocational programs.

Ms. Washington would like to release to Faith House in Pierce County. She would like to be a pet groomer.

Ms. Washington found out in 2011 that she was getting out in 2020 instead of 2013 which she previously thought. She did not act out after learning she would be serving seven additional years.

- **Recommendation:** The panel recommends to the full Board that Ms. Washington be found releasable in February 2019 after transition through lower levels of custody. Ms. Washington must first submit an Offender Release Plan (ORP) and it must be approved by the Board prior to release.
