- Mr. Ray was seen for a Release Hearing on October 3, 2017 at the Monroe Correction Complex – Twin Rivers Unit.
  
- **Summary Discussion**  
Mr. Patnode presented this case.

Mr. Ray is being reviewed by the Board in Clark County Cause 94-1-00753-0 for Rape in the First Degree and Attempted Murder in the First Degree.

The crime involved Mr. Ray physically and sexually assaulting a known 84 year old female. Mr. Ray was 16 years old at the time of the offenses and is currently 40 years of age.

Mr. Ray also has convictions under the same cause for three counts of Burglary in the First Degree for which he has already served.

Risk assessment scores rate him as a moderate risk to re-offend.

Mr. Ray's last infraction was in 2011 for possessing sexually explicit materials. Prior to that his last serious infraction was in 1998.

Since Mr. Ray's last hearing he has completed the Sex Offender Treatment and Assessment Program (SOTAP) and chemical dependency treatment. He has also completed Redemption, Bridges to Life, and is currently enrolled in SOTAP Aftercare and is a tutor in SOTAP. He has completed Alcoholics Anonymous, Toast Masters and his GED and several college courses.

Mr. Ray does have good community support and wants to release to transition housing in King County.

Although Mr. Ray has done well with programming, his crime involves both violence and sexual deviancy. The Board still sees him as a risk to the community and would like him to continue with programming to gain better insight into his offense behavior and become more proficient in controlling his impulses.

- **Recommendation:** The panel recommends that he be found not releasable. Next Action: Re-petition in October 2022.
