- Mr. King was seen for a .100 Hearing on November 7, 2 017 at the Monroe Correctional Complex – Twin Rivers Unit (TRU).
  
- **Summary Discussion**  
Mr. Patnode presented this case.

Mr. King is under the Board’s jurisdiction in King County Cause 71728 for two counts of Rape.

Both rapes involved entering the homes of women and sexually and physically assaulting them during the evening when they were home alone with their children. Mr. King was 24 at the time of the rapes and he is currently 67 years of age.

Risk assessments rate him as a low-moderate to moderate risk to re-offend.

Mr. King has no serious infractions.

Mr. King had previously completed SOTAP in 2008 and has completed Max Benefits on his second attempt. He is currently in Chemical Dependency Treatment.

Mr. King was previously found conditionally parolable in April 2010 to a Mutual Re-Entry Plan (MRP) and 36 months were added to complete transitioning. He was placed at the minimum camp at the Monroe Correctional Complex in June of 2011. He participated in the Sex Offender Treatment and Assessment Program (SOTAP) completer's group. In October 2011 he was placed in segregation pending an investigation of a threat to a female staff at camp.

Mr. King would like to release to Pierce County.

- **Recommendation:** The panel recommends that he be found conditionally parolable to a Mutual Re-Entry Plan. Add 36 months to the minimum term to complete transition. The Board would like him to complete Thinking for a Change which may require an override.
