- Ms. Johnson was seen for a release hearing at the Washington Corrections Center for Women on December 13, 2017
- **Summary Discussion**
Ms. Balmert presented this case.

Ms. Johnson is being reviewed by the Board in Douglas County Cause 97-1-00048-7 for Murder in the First Degree.

The crime involved Ms. Johnson and her two co-defendants “casing” a gun store they intended on robbing. Ms. Johnson stayed in the car as the co-defendants entered the store. She heard gun shots and entered the store. The store owner had been shot twice. Ms. Johnson and her crime partners stole between eighty to one hundred ten firearms. She struck the store owner in the head to put him out of his misery.

Risk assessment scores rate her as a very low to low risk to re-offend.

Ms. Johnson has had seven serious infractions with the last one in 2012. She has had no violent infractions.

Ms. Johnson has completed multiple programs to include her AA Degree. She would like to get her under graduate degree in computer science when she is released. She can work as a hair stylist to support herself.

Ms. Johnson appeared remorseful and ready to transition.

- **Recommendation:** The panel recommends she be found releasable in December 2018 after transition through lower levels of custody and after Board approval of an offender release plan.

Next Action: Submit ORP in August 2018.
