Mrs. Ramsdell-Gilkey presented the case. Mr. Boggs is currently under the jurisdiction of the Indeterminate Sentence Review Board (ISRB) in Pierce County Cause #39137 for Murder in the First Degree. The time start is September 3, 1970. Mr. Boggs is currently serving time on a parole revocation. Mr. Boggs was 20 years old when he committed his crimes and is currently 66 years of age.

Mr. Boggs was seen for a .100 Hearing at the Monroe Correctional Complex – Twin Rivers Unit on September 14 2016. A deferred decision was taken at that hearing.

Risk assessment scores are mixed. On some indicators he is considered high, and on others moderate to high. His criminal history involves the assault and murder of a known 51 year old woman. After a night of drinking and drug use, Mr. Boggs went to the woman's home where he beat her, strangled her and stabbed her in the neck with a letter opener. File material indicates he raped the woman. He lit a couple of fires in the residence before leaving.

He was granted parole in 1991 and within two (2) months of his release, he raped and assaulted two women he met in bars which were plead down to Assault in the Second Degree and Assault in the Third Degree.

Mr. Boggs entered the Sex Offender Treatment and Assessment Program in 2014, but was terminated for comments made about female staff and his denial that he committed any sex offenses. He has not participated in any other programming for several years. He has had two serious infractions since the Board last saw him.

Mr. Boggs has no firm release plan.

The original judge and prosecutor recommendation was considered, and the Board did receive a new recommendation from the prosecutor.

The Board received a recent recommendation from the Pierce County Prosecutor's Office to find Mr. Boggs not releasable.

Recommendation: Not parolable, add 90 months to his minimum term. A new psychological evaluation is requested for the next hearing which will be held 120 days prior to his parole eligibility review date (PERD).

- **Summary Discussion**

Mr. Patnode presented the case. Mr. Jackson is currently under the jurisdiction of the Indeterminate Sentence Review Board (ISRB) in Pierce County Cause 81-1-01205-3 for Rape in the First Degree. The time start is February 18, 1995. Mr. Jackson was 26 years old when he committed his crime and is currently 61 years of age.

Mr. Jackson was seen for a .100 Hearing at the Monroe Correctional Complex – Twin Rivers Unit on September 14 2016. A deferred decision was taken at that hearing.

Risk assessments range from moderate to high. His criminal history involves the rape of a woman who lived alone with her three (3) year old daughter. He initiated a conversation with her and said he could offer her a job if she could demonstrate good physical condition by doing sit ups and leg lifts. While she was on the floor, he grabbed her by the neck and told her if she screamed he would harm her child. Mr. Jackson then rape the woman. Mr. Jackson has multiple stranger rapes and has been paroled and revoked twice. His last revocation was in 1993.

Mr. Jackson has completed the Sex Offender Treatment Program (SOTP), but continues to be a high risk to re-offend. He has completed SOTAP Aftercare, Redemption and Bridges to Life. He has had no infractions in the last ten years.

Mr. Jackson does not have a release plan, and has a Forensic Psychological Evaluation dated February 2016 which finds him to meet criteria for civil commitment.

The Pierce County Prosecutor's Office provided a recommendation urging the Indeterminate Sentence Review Board to reject Mr. Jackson's petition for release referring to the multiple forced rapes and the Forensic Psychological Evaluation dated February 2016.

Recommendation: Not releasable, add 72 months to his minimum term. A new psychological evaluation is requested for the next hearing which will be held 120 days prior to his parole eligibility review date (PERD).
