- **Summary Discussion**

Ms. Rongen presented the case. Mr. Hunsaker is currently under the jurisdiction of the Indeterminate Sentence Review Board (ISRB) in King County Cause #831-102588-3 for Statutory Rape in the First Degree, Count III, and Burglary in the first Degree, Count VI. Mr. Hunsaker was also sentenced under the same cause on Count II Statutory Rape in the Second Degree, Count IV Assault in the Second Degree, Count V Indecent Liberties and Count VII Statutory Rape in the Third Degree. The court ordered all counts to run concurrently. The time start on all counts is December 15, 1983. Counts II, IV and V had a ten year maximum term and Count VII had a five year maximum term. Those terms have expired. Mr. Hunsaker was between the ages of 45 and 50 years when he committed these crimes and he is currently 82 years of age.

Mr. Hunsaker was seen for a parolability hearing at the Monroe Correctional Complex Twin Rivers Unit on November 1, 2016. A deferred decision was taken at the hearing.

Risk assessments scores are low to moderate due to Mr. Hunsaker's age. Offenses involved Mr. Hunsaker approaching six Asian children between the ages of 8 and 16 at their homes while their parents were not present. He would gain entry into their homes under the guise of being a school or other type of official and would do physical exams of the children. He would take their measurements and then take the female children into the bathroom where he would digitally penetrate them. Mr. Hunsaker has a long history of offending against children which also includes a conviction for Lewdness in 1958 for masturbating outside of a church classroom while peeping at children. In 1967 and 1968 he was also convicted of Lewd and Lascivious Acts upon a child.

Mr. Hunsaker has had one recent serious infraction which was dropped to a general infraction.

He completed the Sex Offender Treatment and Assessment Program (SOTAP) in 1998 and was rated as a Moderate to High risk for sexual re-offense. At that time the SOTAP Treatment Summary noted that he demonstrated good arousal controls in treatment and positively changed his dynamic risk factors which the program believed reduced his risk to sexually re-offend.

Mr. Hunsaker was in his seventies when a Forensic Psychological Evaluation (FPE) was completed. The findings were that he met criteria for civil commitment. A private FPE says he does not meet criteria.

Mr. Hunsaker does well in prison. However, his pedophilia is very entrenched and he does not have any health mitigating protective factors.

- **Recommendation:** Not parolable and add 36 months to his minimum term. Schedule a .100 hearing 120 days prior to his parole eligibility review date (PERD). Request re-screening for SOTAP as well as an updated psychological evaluation and an updated FPE.
