ABOUT THE FACILITY

Clallam Bay Corrections Center (CBCC) is the second largest employer in Clallam County. It opened in 1985 as a 450-bed medium custody facility, costing \$56 million. CBCC converted to close custody in 1991 and added a 400-bed medium custody building.

In October 2021, CBCC (warm) closed the 400-bed medium custody building, reducing the capacity to 502. This was a result of both the Blake Decision and the reduction in court sentencing statewide due to COVID-19. As sentencing increases statewide, CBCC expects to reopen the medium custody building before fiscal year 2025.

PROGRAMMING

CBCC partners with Peninsula College to provide college level classes. Peninsula College was recently selected to be part of the State Leadership Team to expand Integrated Education and Training programs in corrections.

Other Programs Include:

 Associate of Applied Science in Business Administration, Licensed Trades Apprenticeship, Computer Programming and Mobile Game Design, Pastry and Specialty Baking and Basic Skills/GED Substance Abuse IOP Treatment, Offender

Enrichment, Cognitive Behavioral, Family Centered and Mental Health classes

Vocational work programs, including Food Service, Electricians, Groundkeepers, Mechanics, Welder and Plumbing apprentice programs, CI Laundry and Recreation

Sustainability programs:

 Outdoor gardens and a greenhouse that provide freshly grown produce for use in CBCC's food kitchen and for donations to local food banks

 The bee program offers advanced training and certification in beekeeping and apiary management. To date, CBCC has four hives and has awarded 24 beginner certificates

CBCC has completed projects that have reduced usage of finite résources.

Recent Facility Projects:

- Replaced diesel boilers and dryers with propane, replaced lighting with LEDs, added electronically-controlled water valves to reduce water consumption, HVAC improvements, new water pumps and more (\$17 million)
- Full replacement of the Simplex fire alarm system (\$4 million)
- Upgrading security cameras and programming (\$6 million)
