Mission Creek Corrections Center for Women (MCCCW) opened in 2005. It first opened in 1960 as a boy's youth camp on land leased from DNR. MCCCW is a minimum-security level female correctional facility. Programs and operations are structured around partnerships and practices that show sustainable reductions in incarcerated individuals returning to prison while also enhancing security for our facility and safety for communities across Washington. MCCCW has partnered with Amend for a full facility implementation of the contact officer program, normalization and dynamic security practices.

PROGRAMMING

- The Trades Related Apprentice Coach (TRAC) teaches valuable skills in the construction industry and draws many in the industry at graduation time
- Aerospace Joint Apprenticeship Committee (AJAC) trains the midsized manufacturing workforce as machinists, industrial maintenance technicians and tool and die makers
- Therapeutic Community is offered to individuals meeting eligibility requirements through American Behavioral Health Systems, engaging an entire living unit in learning and living in sobriety
- Numerous religious and other volunteer groups help meet personal needs
- Partnerships with Kitsap County and Mason County Humane Society provides care for and support adoption of cats and dogs
- Two new pilot programs include the Mini Horse Program and the Chicken Program. MCCCW currently has two mini horses and two chickens
- Other programs include Moving On, Beyond Trauma, Domestic Violence Survival group, Parenting Inside Out, Roots to Success, Read to Me Mommy, Flagger Course, Grief and Loss, Quilting and others. The Legacy Group offers 46 classes, seminars and support groups
