<i>Discussion</i>	The data identifies the counties with the highest need for Work Release resources based on individuals releasing to that area. DOC ultimately wants to put a new facility in a location where Work Release participants will be the most successful and have access to the services they need, which is not necessarily going to be the cheapest location.

<i>Questions/Concerns</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Does that data show that a Work Release facility positively or negatively affects the services/resources around it? <i>The last Work Release facility was opened in 1999 and the data has not supported that it has affected any services/resources negatively.</i> • Do you have demographics of Work Release participants? <i>Yes, the data is provided in the PowerPoint slides from the first meeting, included in the provided binders or on the DOC website.</i> • Will this Work Release be male or female? <i>It will be a co-ed facility.</i> • Will there be services provided at the facility? <i>The idea is for Work Release participants to integrate back into the community so we try to engage them in services off site, as they would normally do.</i>
