SUBJECT: MCC Facility Violator Booking and Housing Protocol

On March 12, 2020, a strike team comprised of Community Corrections Division (CCD), Health Services Division (HS), and Prisons Division staff were tasked with identifying facility options for housing current violators that jails (mainly King County) no longer have the ability to house, and for booking individuals which have been arrested for new violations. Recommendations were reviewed by CCD, HS, and Prisons Leadership, including Dr. Kariko.

Effective immediately, the use of Monroe Correctional Complex (MCC) Washington State Reformatory (WSR) Unit 3A is authorized to house violators. Unit 3A has 72 available beds which can be utilized to house violators post-sanction. This will be in effect until jails are able to book and house violators again.
