SUBJECT: CBCC COVID-19 Weekly Update Memo

As of today, September 9, 2021, Clallam Bay Corrections Center (CBCC) had confirmed a total of forty-eight (48) incarcerated individuals that have tested positive for COVID-19, including those counted in the memo last week. This includes twenty-five (25) from IMU, seven (7) from G unit, and sixteen (16) from A unit.

At this time, Clallam Bay Corrections Center is still on Facility Wide Outbreak status with restricted movement protocols in effect.

The entire facility was tested as listed below, and we are still awaiting those test results.

- G unit (housed in C unit for quarantine/isolation needs) was tested on September 5
- E/F units were tested on September 6
- The rest of the units were tested on September 7

A unit, B unit Green pod, C unit, E unit, and F unit remain on quarantine status. H unit was placed on quarantine status today due to having 1 incarcerated individual also test positive.

The remaining units (B, D, I and J units) will remain on restricted movement due to COVID-19.

These steps are meant to minimize the short and long-term impact that our response will have on our incarcerated population at CBCC. As we move forward you can expect to continue to see cohorting in the dayrooms and shower/bathroom areas, serial testing of our incarcerated population, and an increased awareness to Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) protocols, cleaning, sanitizing, disinfecting, and social distancing. It is our hope by taking these measures that we can cut down on the amount of potential exposures and reduce the amount of time it will take to get back to a new normal with our operations.

It is my understanding that in order to come off of Facility Wide Outbreak status we must receive no new cases in the population in a fourteen (14) day period, with confirmation via two negative test results for every incarcerated individual from tests taken at least seven (7) days apart.

I am hoping that each and every one of you will be committed to following these standards so we can move past these restrictions as quickly as possible. By working together, I know that we can get past this difficult time and get to a place in which we can all have some relief from the restrictions that this pandemic has brought upon us all.

Thank you all for your continued cooperation and patience through this difficult time.
