**SUBJECT:** CBCC COVID-19 Weekly Update Memo

This week, Clallam Bay Corrections Center (CBCC) remains diligent in managing the potential for COVID-19 exposure for both staff and the incarcerated population. As a result, both E unit and G unit have been removed from quarantine status and the G unit population will be returned to G unit.

The results from our facility-wide testing this week have identified an additional twenty-five (25) incarcerated individuals that tested positive for COVID-19, including twenty-four (24) from A and H units and one (1) from F unit. At this time, Clallam Bay Corrections Center is still on Facility Wide Outbreak status with restricted movement protocols in effect.

Current quarantine or isolation protocols are still in effect for the following areas:

- A unit remains on quarantine status
  - o A unit Red pod is being used for close custody isolation cases
- B unit Green pod is identified for high-risk quarantine cases
- C unit Green pod will continue to house medium custody isolation cases
- F unit remains on quarantine/isolation status
- H unit is now on quarantine status

The remaining units (B, D, I and J units) will remain on restricted movement due to COVID-19 and E unit will resume normal Restricted Housing Unit (RHU) operations.

We should all feel encouraged that we have seen progress and reduced spread as we continue to work several units through the COVID-19 protocols. Moving forward, by remaining vigilant with the COVID-19 protocols we can expect to make continue progress in reducing potential exposures and the amount of time it will take to get back to a new normal with our operations. These protocols include, but are not limited to, cohorting in the dayrooms and shower/bathroom areas, serial testing our incarcerated population, and an increased awareness to Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) protocols, cleaning, sanitizing, disinfecting, and social distancing

I want to thank every one of you for your commitment to following these standards so we can move past these restrictions as quickly as possible. By working together, I know that we can get past this difficult time and get to a place in which we can all have some relief from the restrictions that this pandemic has brought upon us all.

Thank you all for your continued cooperation and patience through this difficult time.
