SUBJECT: Stafford Creek Corrections Center COVID-19 Limited Area Outbreak – G Unit and H1 Living Units.

On May 5, 2021, the Department announced an update to the COVID-19 protocols and shared the definition of a Limited Area Outbreak. Facilities that experience an outbreak, that is very limited to one area, may be placed on a Limited Area Outbreak. Meaning only the impacted area would be on outbreak status.

On February 25, 2022, Stafford Creek Correction Center was downgraded from Facility Wide Outbreak Status to Limited Area Outbreak Status in G and H1 Living Units.

G Unit and H1 will remain on Quarantine status. Weekly testing for G and H1 will be conducted on Monday February 28, 2022.

As you are aware, facility status is subject to change as we continue to control the transmission of COVID-19 and evaluate Staff and Incarcerated cases in all work/living areas.

Living Units H2, H3, H4, H5 and H6 will now have access to Correctional Industries, Education, Property, Recreation (for Hobby items and Musical Instruments), Records reviews, Resolution Program and Hearings.

It is imperative to make sure you continue to wear your appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), as well as social distancing at all times. Please encourage and model the same behavior that we expect from our incarcerated population.

Similarly, it is vital that we continue to follow the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) guidelines, ensuring to follow the six (6) foot social distancing rule, washing your hands, and keeping areas of the institution sanitized. Staff must remain diligent in wearing your masks at all times, as your safety, as well as your family's, are a priority.

Corrections is committed to everyone's safety. We will continue to communicate with you as we progress through this pandemic.
