SUBJECT: SCCC COVID-19 Limited Area Outbreak – H2, H3, and H4

On May 5, 2021, the Department announced an update to the COVID-19 protocols and shared the definition of a Limited Area Outbreak. Facilities that experience an outbreak, that is very limited to one area, may be placed on a Limited Area Outbreak. Meaning only the impacted area would be on outbreak status.

On April 15, 2022, SCCC received one (1) COVID-19 positive tests out of H2, H3, and H4 in addition to one positive staff test. Due to these positive tests and according to department protocol, these units have been placed on Limited Area Outbreak.

H2, H3, and H4 living units are being placed on quarantine and will begin following testing protocols immediately.

Beginning April 16, 2022, at 6 a.m., these units will be allowed movements by pod to Grab n' Go mainline, outside yard, and pill line. There will be no indoor recreation movements for these units.

In-person/regular visits for these units have been paused effective April 15, 2022, at 1:30 p.m. Any pre-scheduled extended-family visits for these units will need to be confirmed with the facility prior to scheduled date.

It is imperative to make sure you continue to wear your appropriate [personal protective equipment \(PPE\)](#), as well as social distancing at all times. Please encourage and model the same behavior that we expect from our incarcerated population.

Similarly, it is vital that we continue to follow the [Centers for Disease Control \(CDC\) guidelines](#), ensuring to follow the six foot social-distancing rule, washing your hands, and keeping areas of the institution sanitized. Staff must remain diligent in wearing your masks at all times, as your safety, as well as your family's, are a priority.

Corrections is committed to everyone's safety. We will continue to communicate with you as we progress through this pandemic.
