- Roger Alderman was seen for a .100 hearing on December 17, 2024 at the Airway Heights Corrections Center.

• Summary Discussion

Kecia Rongen presented the case to the full Board.

• Roger Alderman is under the jurisdiction of the Board for their conviction of two counts of Rape in the First Degree; three counts of Burglary in the Second Degree; three counts of Burglary in the Second Degree in Kitsap County Cause 80-1-00130-1.

The underlying convictions are noted as Mr. Alderman engaging in a series of burglaries between December of 1979 and March of 1980, wherein he would

break into the residences of elderly single women. He was 26 years of age at the time of the crime and is currently 71 years of age.

Previous Criminal History:

Mr. Alderman has a 1973 conviction in the state of Montana for Armed Robbery, and he received a 15 year sentence, however, he escaped and had three more years added to his sentence. Twice, while out on parole, he was accused of rape and murder and fled to Washington State when he committed the crimes that put him under the jurisdiction of the Indeterminate Sentence Review Board (ISRB).

Risk assessments show him to be a moderate high risk to re-offend.

Mr. Alderman's last serious infraction was in 2011.

Mr. Alderman completed Sex Offense Treatment and Assessment Program during his incarceration.

Mr. Alderman would like to utilize the DOC voucher program should he be released. He also has support from his church.
