- Mr. Rivas was seen for a .100 hearing at the Monroe Correctional Complex – Twin Rivers Unit on January 8, 2019.
  
- **Summary Discussion**  
Ms. Balmert presented this case.

Mr. Rivas is under the jurisdiction of the Board in Skagit County Cause 82-1-00152-9 for Attempted Murder in the First Degree and Rape in the First Degree.

The crime involved Mr. Rivas using a rouse to get into an unknown female's vehicle. He raped her at knifepoint, tied her hands and feet and pushed her car into a river. She was able to escape from the vehicle and swim part way to shore where she was discovered by two fisherman. Mr. Rivas was 29 years old at the time of the crime and he is currently 66 years of age.

When Mr. Rivas was 21 years of age he committed Assault in the Second Degree in Whatcom County Cause 9191. At the age of 27 he committed Rape in the Second Degree in Skagit County Cause 3919. Both of these crimes have reached their statutory maximum.

There is no overall risk listed in the Forensic Psychological dated February 2, 2017. According to this report, Mr. Rivas does not meet criteria for Civil Commitment. His risk is mitigated by his age, health and completed programs.

Mr. Rivas' has a total of nine infractions with his last infraction occurring in 2013.

Mr. Rivas is currently participating in the Intensive Day Treatment Program which is a chemical dependency program. He also attends AA and has a referral for Intensive Outpatient Treatment (IOP), and he has completed Living Smart. He was unable to participate in a Mutual Re-Entry Plan due to his health.

Mr. Rivas appears to understand the impact of his crimes and is remorseful.

He would like to release transition housing. He has support from his family and is eligible for Social Security.

- **Decision**  
**The panel finds Mr. Rivas parolable.**
- **Reasons:**
  - **Completed risk related programming; Sex Offender Treatment and Assessment Program (SOTAP) and Aftercare**
  - **Completed chemical dependency treatment and attends AA**
  - **Extensive and significant medical issues that mitigate risk**
  - **Static 99-R 2 Points Low to Moderate risk**
- **Next Action:** Submit Offender Release Plan

**Recommendations:**

Mr. Rivas should abstain from any mind altering substances and attend sober support groups. He should enter into and successfully complete the community portion of SOTAP.
