- An updated prosecutor recommendation was not received.

- Mr. Evans was seen for a .100 hearing at the Washington Corrections Center on January 16, 2019.

- **Summary Discussion**
Mrs. Ramsdell-Gilkey presented this case.

Mr. Evans is under the jurisdiction of the Board in Clark County Cause 81-1-00360-5 for Murder in the First Degree Count I. Mr. Evans also has a Theft in the Second Degree (While Armed with a Deadly Weapon) Count II which has reached the statutory maximum.

The crime involved Mr. Evans shooting and killing his landlord after an argument. He has his girlfriend moved the body to a shed and told the other tenants he had taken the landlord to the hospital because he was ill. He was

arrested the next day. Mr. Evans was 17 years old at the time of the murder and he is currently 54 years of age.

Risk assessment scores rate him as an overall moderate risk to re-offend.

Mr. Evans has had nine infractions since his last hearing.

Mr. Evans has completed Moral Reconciliation Therapy and has participated in Celebrate Recovery.

Mr. Evans would like to release to a structured setting.

- **Decision**
The panel finds him not parolable and adds 36 months to his minimum term.
- **Reasons:**
 - **Has incurred an additional 9 serious infractions just since his last hearing, one of which was a serious fight.**
 - **Did not complete the programming recommended by the Board at the last hearing.**
- **Next Action:** Schedule .100 120 days prior to parole eligibility review date (PERD).

Recommendations:

It is critical that Mr. Evans improve his prison behavior and demonstrate he has the ability to control himself. He needs to cease the types of behaviors that are continually causing him to be sent to the IMU or to a different prison. The Board continues to recommend he complete Thinking for a Change. He should work on a detailed community release plan and seek out community supports. As Mr. Evans has indicated he has gone through a spiritual change now, it is expected he will be able to comply with these recommendations.
