- An updated prosecutor recommendation was received.

- Mr. Anderson was seen for a .100 Hearing at the Airway Heights Corrections Center on February 23, 2021.

- **Summary Discussion**
Mrs. Ramsdell-Gilkey presented this case.

Mr. Anderson is under the jurisdiction of the Board and currently serving on Spokane County Cause 79-1-00490-2 for Rape in the First-Degree Count V and Robbery in the First-Degree Count VI.

Prior to moving to these counts, he served the following:

- Spokane County Cause 79-1-00490-2 Count XI for Robbery; Count XII, XIII XIV and XV for Kidnapping in the First Degree and Count IV for Robbery in the First Degree.

- Benton County Cause 78-025 for Robbery in the First Degree (While Arm with a Deadly Weapon)
- Benton County Cause 78-054
 - Rape in the First Degree Count I and Robbery in the First-Degree Count II both (While Armed with a Deadly Weapon)
 - Kidnapping in the First-Degree Count III (While Armed with a Deadly Weapon)
 - Kidnapping in the First-Degree Count IV (While Armed with a Deadly Weapon), Unlawful Possession of a Firearm Count V
- Spokane County Cause 26472 for Robbery in the First Degree Count I (While Armed with a Deadly Weapon) Count I; Assault in the Third-Degree Count II and Escape in the Second-Degree Count VI. Counts II and VI have reached their statutory maximum.
- The crimes listed above involve a series of robberies, rapes, assaults, and kidnappings that occurred over a three-month period. Mr. Anderson was 24 years old at the time and is currently 67 years of age.

Risk Assessments show Mr. Anderson is a low to moderate risk to reoffend.

Mr. Anderson has had no serious infractions since 2006, and no violent infractions since 1991.

Mr. Anderson has completed Thinking for a Change (T4C), Champions and the Sex Offender Treatment and Assessment Program (SOTAP). He works in the CI Warehouse and has received excellent work reports.

Mr. Anderson would like to release to Lincoln House in Spokane to help him transition back into the community. He has family support in the community as well as support from his original defense attorney Mr. Critchlow.

- **Decision** – Mr. Anderson is parolable.
- **Reasons:**
 - Successfully completed recommended offense related treatment since the last Board meeting to include the Sex Offender Treatment and Assessment Program (SOTAP) and the Champions Therapeutic Community (substance abuse).
 - Has maintained very positive prison behavior for the past 15 years, incurring no serious infractions and remaining employed as a valued worker in the Correctional Industries (CI) Warehouse.
 - Transferred to a camp setting and did very well.
 - Level 2, Low/Moderate risk sex offender.

- Positive psychological report that notes that although the actuarial statistics indicate a Moderate risk for violent re-offense, the manner in which he has lived his life for many years would indicate this is probably an overestimate of his actual risk.
- Appears to have undergone a personal transformation many years ago and demonstrates this daily in his interactions with others;
- Has positive support from his wife, children and grandchildren in the community.

- **Recommendations:**
Mr. Anderson will need to accept all assistance available to him to help in adjusting to the community. He understands he is required to complete the community phase of the SOTAP. He should surround himself with prosocial persons and remain clean and sober for the rest of his life.

- **Next Action:** Submit Offender Release Plan (ORP)
