- An updated prosecutor recommendation was received with no recommendation.

- Mr. Frazier was seen for a .100 Hearing on March 3, 2021 at the Monroe Correctional Complex – Twin Rivers Unit.

- **Summary Discussion**
Ms. Davis presented this case.

- Mr. Frazier is under the jurisdiction of the Board in Kitsap County Cause 81-1-00394-8 for Murder in the First Degree.

The murder involved Mr. Frazier and a co-defendant confronting an 83 year old man in an alley, robbing him of his valuables and severely beating him. The victim died a few days later due to his injuries received during the

robbery. Mr. Frazier was 15 years old at the time of the crime and is currently 52 years of age.

Mr. Frazier has three failed prior attempts at parole. Violations for his last Revocation Hearing included a serious law violation where he attempted to elude officers. The other two paroles ended in law violations as well.

Mr. Frazier's juvenile criminal history involved a Theft in the Second Degree and a Criminal Trespass in the Second Degree one year prior to the Murder. These matters were diverted and several months later he was charged with Challenging to Fight in Public in California. He was returned to Washington to the Crisis Residential Center where he had to be restrained by police because he was out of control.

Mr. Frazier's approach of positive impression management during his psychological evaluation made it difficult for the evaluator to determine level of risk. However, other risk assessments suggest he remains a high risk to re-offend.

Mr. Frazier has not had any infractions since his last hearing in 2017.

Mr. Frazier works as a custodian on the unit and continues to take educational courses. However, he has not taken any programming to address his criminal behavior.

Mr. Frazier continues to minimize his parole violations.

Mr. Frazier would like to release to Snohomish County.

- **Decision:** Not parolable. Add 48 months to minimum term.
- **Reasons:**
 - **Mr. Frazier has had three revocations within the past ten years, and each has involved either possession of controlled substance, possession of a deadly weapon, failure to abide by all laws, or all three**
 - **He has not participated in any programming since his revocation to improve his decision-making in the community or provide him with skills necessary to comply with supervision.**
 - **Mr. Frazier's VRAG score fell within Bin 9 of 9, which estimates a 76% likelihood he will re-offend within 5 years, and 87% that he will re-offend within 12 years. PCL-R scored very high range for psychopathy, very high risk to re-offend**

- **Recommendation:**
Mr. Frazier should take advantage of any offender related programming such as Thinking for a Change and Redemption that will provide him with better problem-solving skills in the community and mitigate his chances of re-offending in the community.
- **Next action:** Schedule .100 Hearing 120 days prior to parole eligibility review date (PERD).
