- An updated prosecutor recommendation was received recommending against release.
  
- Mr. Jackson was seen for a .100 hearing on March 3, 2021 at the Monroe Correctional Complex – Twin Rivers Unit.
  
- **Summary Discussion**  
Ms. Balmert presented the case to the full Board
  
- Mr. Jackson is under the jurisdiction of the Board for his conviction of in Pierce County Cause 81-1-01205-3 for Rape in the First Degree.

The crime involved Mr. Jackson gaining entry to an apartment of a woman and her three-year-old child. He told the woman he could offer her a job if she could demonstrate good physical condition and had her do exercises

demonstrating her good health. He then grabbed her by the neck and told her he would hurt her child if she screamed. He pulled her into her bedroom and raped her. Mr. Jackson was 28 at the time of the crime and is currently 65 years of age.

Mr. Jackson has a conviction for rape out of King County which he committed when he was 20 years old. He was paroled twice on this conviction and during the second parole he committed the rape for which he is now serving.

Risk assessments show him to be a moderate risk to re-offend.

Mr. Jackson's last serious infraction was in 2006.

Mr. Jackson has been participating in vocation/education classes, works in food preparation, and receives above average evaluations from his supervisors.

Mr. Jackson has completed the Sex Offender Treatment and Assessment Program (SOTAP) twice, aftercare and other risk related programming.

Mr. Jackson has significant health issues that reduce his risk. He would like to transition through lower levels of custody prior to releasing back into the community.

- **Decision:**

The panel recommends a finding of conditionally parolable and adds 24 months to his minimum term to provide time to transition.

- **Reasons:**

- An updated Forensic Psychological Evaluation was completed by Dr. Marianne Davis on January 27, 2021. That evaluation found that Mr. Jackson DOES NOT MEET criteria as a Sexually Violent Predator under RCW 71.09.
- Psychologist report by Dr. Robtoy his risk assessment tools suggest his risk to be Moderate/High, but his protective factors are moderate which might bring his risk level closer to moderate.
- He has completed the core Sex Offender Treatment and Assessment Program (SOTAP) twice and the aftercare portion.
- He appears to understand his high risks and Interventions.
- He has completed several additional risk related programs, most notably chemical dependency (CD) treatment programs, Stress and Anger Management, Victim Awareness, Redemption and Bridges to Life.

- He has had no Serious Infractions since 2006, is reported to be pleasant and has no issues on the Unit.
- Age and medical issues may mitigate his risk.
  
- **Recommendations:**
  - Mr. Jackson should continue to focus on continuing with his positive behavior along with transitioning through Camp if eligible and preparing for release to the community. If Camp is not available to Mr. Jackson, he may write the Board and request an earlier Hearing.
  
- **Next Action:**
  - Schedule .100 120 days prior to parole eligibility review date. If recommended programming is not available, Mr. Jackson can write to the Board to request an earlier hearing.
