- An updated prosecutor recommendation was not received.

- Mr. Libby was seen for a .100 Hearing on March 17, 2021 at Coyote Ridge Corrections Center.

- **Summary Discussion**
Ms. Davis presented this case.

Mr. Libby is under the jurisdiction of the Board in Lewis County Cause 83-1-00143-3 for Statutory Rape in the First Degree.

The offense included Mr. Libby sexually assaulting and torturing three known minor females with whom he had been residing as their live-in babysitter. Mr. Libby was 33 or 34 at the time of the offenses and he is currently 74 years of age.

Risk assessment scores rate him as a moderate to moderate-high risk to re-offend.

Mr. Libby has had no infractions since his last hearing in November of 2017. However, he did commit a sexual harassment infraction four years ago and is an untreated sex offender.

Mr. Libby has refused to participate in programming.

Mr. Libby would like to release to his fiancé.

- **Decision:** Not parolable, add 36 months to his minimum term.
- **Reasons:**
 - Mr. Libby scored HRC-20 Moderate risk for committing future violence, PCL-R Moderate range for Psychopathy & Moderately high risk to reoffend, SAPROF- low range for protective factors, and VRAG 6 of 9,
 - He refuses to take any offender related programming that will reduce his risk to reoffend
 - He is assessed as an ESRC level Three
 - Mr. Libby denies his sexual offending behavior and show no insight into the circumstances that resulted in his conviction.
 - Mr. Libby could provide any evidence to demonstrate to the Board that he is rehabilitated and a fit subject for release
- **Recommendation:**

Mr. Libby should be rescreened for Thinking for a Change. The Board will be requesting an override to get him into that program. Mr. Libby should also take any programming that will help ease his transition into the community and develop a detailed release plan.
- **Next Action:** Schedule .100 Hearing 120 days prior to his parole eligibility review date (PERD).
