- Mr. Evans was seen for a .100 hearing at the Airway Heights Correction Center on March 23, 2021

- **Summary Discussion**
Mrs. Ramsdell-Gilkey presented this case.

Mr. Evans is under the jurisdiction of the Board in Clark County Cause 81-1-00360-5 for Murder in the First-Degree Count I. Mr. Evans also has a Theft in the Second Degree (While Armed with a Deadly Weapon) Count II which has reached the statutory maximum.

The crime involved Mr. Evans shooting and killing his landlord after an argument. He and his girlfriend moved the body to a shed and told the other tenants he had taken the landlord to the hospital because he was ill. He was arrested the next day. Mr. Evans was 17 years old at the time of the murder and he is currently 56 years of age.

Risk assessment scores rate him as an overall moderate to moderate high risk to re-offend.

Mr. Evans' last violent infraction was in 2016 and he has committed less infractions over time.

Mr. Evans has not completed a lot of programming. However, he was participating in Thinking for a Change (T4C) which is now on hold due to COVID. He has completed workbooks for PTSD and Anxiety.

Mr. Evans would like to release to a structured setting such as the House of Mercy. He would like DOC Re-Entry to help with his release. He does have some family support.

- **Decision**

The panel finds him parolable.

- **Reasons:**

- Mr. Evans has improved his prison behavior;
- He entered the T4C program as recommended and was on week 12 when it was put on hold due to the Covid-19 pandemic;
- He has actively participated in mental health counseling and is responsible for storing and taking his prescribed medications;
- He has a progressive disease that requires him to use a walker and should be a mitigating factor.

- **Recommendation:**

- It will be critical that Mr. Evans immediately enter mental health counseling in the community and continue to take his medications as prescribed. He should take advantage of any re-entry services available. He should establish open and honest communication with his Community Corrections Officer and ask for assistance as needed.

- **Next Action:** Submit an Offender Release Plan (ORP).
