- An updated prosecutor recommendation was received recommending no release.
  
- Mr. Green was seen for a .100 hearing on March 23, 2021 at the Airway Heights Correction Center.
  
- **Summary Discussion**  
Mr. Patnode presented the case to the full Board.
  
- Mr. Green is being seen by the Board for his conviction of Murder in the First Degree in King County Cause 78729.

The crime involved Mr. Green attacking an eight-year-old girl whom he came across in an ally. When she screamed, he stabbed her in the chest. He moved her to an alcove in the ally so he could rape her, but a neighbor had

heard her scream and interrupted Mr. Green. Mr. Green informed the neighbor he was trying to assist the victim and asked the neighbor to go get help. The eight-year-old girl died from the wound inflicted upon her by Mr. Green. He was 18 years of age at the time of the crime and is currently 63 years of age.

Mr. Green was originally sentenced to death and was later re-sentenced to Murder in the First Degree (While Armed with a Deadly Weapon). He has an extensive juvenile criminal history.

Risk assessments show him to be a high risk to re-offend.

Mr. Green has committed nine infractions since his last hearing in February of 2016.

Mr. Green has done no programming. The Board would like him to complete the Sex Offender Treatment and Assessment Program (SOTAP).

Mr. Green does not have an active mental health plan.

**Decision:**

The panel recommends he be found not parolable and 60 months be added to his minimum term.

• **Reasons:**

- As was the case during his last hearings, Mr. Green continues to lack insight into his offending behavior and still has not requested to participate in the Sex Offender Treatment and Assessment Program Aftercare. He indicated he does not believe he needs additional treatment.
- He has completed limited offender change programming to address his criminogenic needs.
- He has not managed his behavior and incurred nine serious infractions since his last Board Hearing in 2016.
- In the most recent psychological Evaluation completed November 9, 2020, Dr. Richel stated his feeling that Mr. Green represents a High risk for violent recidivism. He stated, "Without further treatment, and fundamental shifts in attitudes towards cooperating with sex offender treatment and management specialists, especially when combined with Mr. Green's overall risk appraisal, this psychologist cannot confidently suggest that Mr. Green is a good candidate for management in a less restrictive environment."

- Dr. Richel also noted in the November 2020 Psychological Evaluation that if the ISRB were to choose to release Mr. Green to a less restrictive environment, he would recommend Mr. Green be evaluated by an external Forensic Psychologist to establish whether or not he meets criteria for civil commitment under the 71.09 Sexual Violent Predator law.
- Mr. Green does not appear to be a fully rehabilitated and fit subject for release and has made little progress since his last Board Hearing in 2016.
- **Recommendations:**
  - The Board would like to see Mr. Green participate in any programming available, to include the SOTAP program at any level assessed as eligible, which may provide him insight related to his criminogenic factors and reduce his risk to the community. Additionally, he needs to improve his behavior and refrain from behavior that results in serious infractions.
- **Next Action:**
  - Schedule .100 120 days prior to his parole eligibility review date. If he completes SOTAP, the Board will see him earlier.
