- An updated prosecutor recommendation was not received.

- Mr. Beaver was seen for a release hearing on April 13, 2021 at Stafford Creek Correction Center.

- **Summary Discussion**
Mr. Patnode presented the case to the full Board

- Mr. Beaver is being seen by the Board for his convictions of Count I Attempted Robbery in the First Degree with a firearm; Count II Assault in the First Degree with a firearm; Count III Unlawful Possession of a Firearm; Count VII Assault in the Second Degree with a deadly weapon and firearm in King County Cause #00-1-02680-0.

The crime involved Mr. Beaver and a co-defendant entering a jewelry store with the intent to commit a robbery while a third co-defendant waited outside in a stolen vehicle. There were several people in the jewelry store and Mr. Beaver and his co-defendant were armed. Mr. Beaver pointed his gun at a store employee who shot Mr. Beaver in the chest. Mr. Beaver crawled out a shattered window and made it two blocks down the street before collapsing. His co-defendant fired off several shots and jumped in the car with the third co-defendant and ended up in a high-speed chase with the Police. Mr. Beaver was 17 years of age at the time of the crimes and is currently 38 years of age.

Mr. Beaver has a significant juvenile criminal history.

Risk assessments show Mr. Beaver to be a low to moderate risk to re-offend.

Mr. Beaver had an infraction for fighting in 2011, but his last infraction was in 2015 for possessing Spice.

Mr. Beaver has completed many educational and vocational programs.

Mr. Beaver takes responsibility for crimes for which he is convicted.

Mr. Beaver would like to release to his wife in Vancouver.

- **Decision:**

The panel recommends Mr. Beaver be found releasable

- **Reasons:**

- Mr. Beaver has made positive efforts in prison, taken personal responsibility for his index offense, and completed several education/vocational and offender change programs.
- He has held long term prison employment and received extra ordinary reports from his supervisors.
- He has not had a serious infraction since 2015.
- Mr. Beaver verbalizes insight into the behaviors that resulted in his crimes and participated in programming that mitigates his risk in these areas.
- In his psychological evaluation from Dr. Robtoy dated December 1, 2020, he was determined to be a low/moderate for overall risk.
- In the December 2020 psychological evaluation, Dr. Robtoy opined "Mr. Beaver appears to have learned to manage the stresses of daily life reasonably well. At the time of this evaluation he did not appear to be a management problem, was employed, and had completed

several programs/courses”.

- **Recommendations:**

- Mr. Beaver should have controls related to substance use, refrain from associating with antisocial peers with gang affiliation, and have a chemical dependency (CD) evaluation and follow all treatment recommendations.

- **Next Action:**

- Submit Offender Release Plan (ORP).
