- Norman Nason was seen for a .100 hearing on April 30, 2024, at the Monroe Correctional Complex.
- Summary Discussion

Jill Getty presented the case to the full Board.

 Norman Nason is under the jurisdiction of the Board for their conviction of Statutory Rape in the First Degree in Spokane County Cause 79-1-00249-7.

Ms. Nason approached two minor boys, ages 5 and 7, while walking to school. She proceeded to take them into an alley and sexually assault them. She was 20 years of age at the time of the crime and is currently 65 years of age.

## **Previous Criminal History:**

At the age of 18 and 19, Ms. Nason's criminal history includes sexual assault against young boys at approximately 7 years of age.

Risk assessments show her to be a low-moderate risk to re-offend.

Ms. Nason's last serious infraction was in 2002.

Ms. Nason has participated in multiple programs while incarcerated as well as being employed.

Ms. Nason plans on utilizing the program available through the Journey Project.

### Decision:

The panel recommends Ms. Nason be released.

#### Reasons:

- Institutional employment with positive work reviews; contacts with mental health services as needed; previously completed the SOTAP (2016).
- No new serious infractions since 2002.
- Recent actuarial assessments estimate her risk to be low/moderate to moderate for sexual and violent recidivism.
- Release plan to the Journey Project.

# Recommendations:

- Sex Offense Treatment and Assessment Program (SOTAP), Community Phase
- Strong controls around alcohol use
- Strong controls around drug use
- Strong Controls around minor contact
- Strong controls around relationships
- Electronic Monitoring
