- An updated prosecutor recommendation was received indicating King County Prosecutor does not support release.

- William Barker was seen for .100 hearing on May 22, 2024 at the Airway Heights Corrections Center.

- **Summary Discussion**
Jeff Patnode presented the case to the full Board.

- William Barker is under the jurisdiction of the Board for their conviction of Rape in the First Degree King County Cause 81-1-02710-1.

Mr. Barker attacked two teens in a park late at night and sexually assaulted the female. He was 25 years of age at the time of the crime and is currently 68 years of age.

Previous Criminal History:

Mr. Barker’s criminal history began in 1974 with a Robbery charge. Since then, his history has consisted of theft, criminal trespass, and the use of weapons.

Risk assessments show him to be a high risk to re-offend.

Mr. Barker has received multiple serious infractions while incarcerated.

No new programming for Mr. Barker was noted.

Mr. Barker did not appear at his hearing, therefore no release plan was discussed.

- **Decision:**
The panel recommends Not parolable. Add 90 months to Minimum Term.

- **Reasons:**
 - He has declined to participate in his psychological evaluation and his Board .100 Hearings.
 - Multiple Serious Infraction including violence.
 - Recent Psychological Evaluation and 2010 FPE which indicates he meets 71.09 SVP criteria.

- **Recommendations:**
 - Mental Health Treatment
 - Thinking for a Change, Redemption, Bridges to Life, Alternatives to Violence, Domestic Violence Treatment
 - Remain infraction free and have positive interactions with staff
 - Participate in next hearing
 - Develop a release plan/community support

- **Next Action:**
 - Release on Maximum Expiration Date. Schedule a Cashaw like Hearing. The Board will need an updated psychological evaluation for his next hearing to assess his fitness for release.
