- Mr. Fletcher was seen for a .100 hearing on June 22, 2021 at Stafford Creek Corrections Center.

- **Summary Discussion**
Ms. Balmert presented the case to the full Board

Mr. Fletcher is under the jurisdiction of the Board in Clark County Cause 81-11188-2 for Taking a Motor Vehicle without Permission and Robbery in the First Degree.

Mr. Fletcher was also convicted of two counts of First-Degree Burglary in Oregon and has 1979 convictions for Possession of a Controlled Substance,

Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle and Burglary and Forced Entry of a Residence.

The Robbery in the First Degree involved Mr. Fletcher robbing a convenience store attendant at knifepoint. He was 19 years old at the time of this crime and is currently 59 years of age.

While on parole for the Robbery 1, Mr. Fletcher forced his way into the home of a young woman after pretending that he needed to use her phone. He threatened to kill her and then stabbed her several times.

In November of 2016, the Board continued to find him conditionally parolable to a Mutual Re-Entry Plan (MRP) and added 24 months to his minimum term to complete transition through camp and then work release. Mr. Fletcher was transferred to the Washington Corrections Center in September of 2017. He had been transferred to Cedar Creek Corrections Center as part of his MRP. While at Cedar Creek he felt threatened by other inmates and asked to be removed from camp. In December of 2017, Mr. Fletcher had a hearing with the Board and was found not parolable and sixty (60) months were added to his minimum term.

Risk assessments show him to be a low mod to moderate risk for violence. However, it is Dr. Robtoy's clinical opinion, if he were to recidivate, it would be non-violent.

Mr. Fletcher's last infraction was in 2017 for refusing to cell. His behavior is better.

Mr. Fletcher has completed risk relating programing to include substance abuse treatment, Thinking for a Change, Alternatives to Violence, Victim Awareness and Stress/Anger Management.

Mr. Fletcher would like to release to a clean and sober transition house. He has no support in the community.

- **Decision:**

The panel recommends Mr. Fletcher be found conditionally parolable to a Mutual Re-entry Plan (MRP) and adds 18 months to his minimum term to complete programming and work release.
- **Reasons:**
 - Psychological Evaluation by Dr. Robtoy; Risk Assessment tools rate his risk Low/Moderate to Moderate for violent recidivism. However, her clinical opinion was that if Mr. Fletcher were to recidivate, he is more

likely to commit a non-violent crime, or even more likely violate the conditions of his supervision.

- He has completed risk related programming; substance abuse treatment x 2 (IOP & TC), Thinking for Change, Alternatives to Violence, Victim Awareness and Standardized Stress/Anger Management.
- He has managed his behavior in prison with no violent Serious Infractions since 2008.
- He has lifetime supervision.

- **Recommendations:**
 - Mr. Fletcher should use his time in the work release program to obtain employment and gain skills so that he may successfully transition into the community. He should work on gaining positive peer support in the community and not socialize with antisocial peers.

- **Next Action:**
 - Schedule .100 hearing 120 days prior to parole eligibility review date (PERD).
