- Donald Osborne was seen for a .100 hearing on July 10th, 2024 at the Monroe Correctional Complex facility.

Summary Discussion

Elyse Balmert presented the case to the full Board.

Donald Osborne is under the jurisdiction of the Board for his conviction of Kidnapping in the First Degree in Snohomish County Cause 82-1-00510-4.

The crime involved the abduction of an unknown 4-year-old female from a recreational area. A high-speed chase with law enforcement followed which

resulted in collisions between, police, and bystanders' vehicles. He was 30 years of age at the time of the crime and is currently 72 years of age.

Previous Criminal History:

Mr. Osborne has a previous Indecent Liberties conviction in 1979 and was the subject of two other sex offenses not resulting in convictions.

Risk assessments show him to be a low moderate/moderate risk to reoffend.

Mr. Osborne has had no serious infractions in 17 years

Mr. Osborne has completed core SOTAP 3 times as well as Substance Use Disorder treatment

Mr. Osborne plans to release to a transitional home or his brother.

Decision:

The panel recommends Conditional Parole to MRP. The Board would like Mr. Osborne to receive additional assistance on re-entry and a step-down to a camp if eligible.

Reasons:

- He has completed the core SOTAP (X 3) with a positive report from his provider.
- He appears to understand his Dynamic Risk Factors and Interventions, which should result in mitigated risk to the community.
- He has held employment with good reports from his supervisor.
- He has not had any Serious Infractions in over 17 years.
- He has community support and a reasonable release plan.

Recommendations:

- Sex Offense Treatment and Assessment Program (SOTAP), Community Phase
- Strong controls around alcohol use
- Strong controls around drug use
- Strong Controls around minor contact
- Strong controls around relationships
- Internet Monitoring
- Sober Support Groups

Next Action:

• Schedule a .100 hearing approximately 120 days prior to PERD.
