- An updated prosecutor recommendation was received recommending no early release.

- Mr. Ramires was seen for a release hearing at the Monroe Correctional Complex – Washington State Reformatory on July 15, 2020.

- **Summary Discussion**
Ms. Rongen presented the case to the full Board.

Mr. Ramires is being seen by the Board in Yakima County Cause #99-1-01138-0 for Attempt – Murder in the First Degree with a Firearm.

Mr. Ramires was pulled over by a Yakima Police Officer for a traffic stop. He had been using cocaine and marijuana. Mr. Ramires shot the officer twice in the chest. Mr. Ramires and the other occupant in the car fled and were

apprehended the next day. The police officer survived. Mr. Ramirez was 17 years old at the time of the crime and is currently 38 years of age.

Mr. Ramirez has no known criminal history. He does have a detainer to Mexico.

Risk assessments show Mr. Ramirez to be a moderate risk to re-offend.

Mr. Ramirez' last infraction was in 2015 and he has had 36 serious infractions overall.

Mr. Ramirez has completed several programs to include Standardized Stress/Anger Management; Moral Reconciliation Therapy; Thinking for a Change; Advanced Skill Building; Life Skills Computing, Roots of Success; Substance Abuse Intensive Outpatient; SMART Recover; Bridges to Life; Re-entry JSRB; Career Bridge; Toastmasters; and CTAP and Makin it Work. He also has several positive behavior observations.

Mr. Ramirez has a detainer to Mexico where he plans on living with his mother and helping with her care.

- **Decision:**
The panel recommends Mr. Ramirez be found releasable.
- **Reasons:**
 - Completed a number of change programs and has been employed with positive reports;
 - No behavioral problems for five years, numerous positive behavioral observations;
 - He has a support system in Mexico,
 - Takes responsibility for his crime and appears to have insight into the risk factors that led up to the crime,
 - Assessed as a moderate risk to re-offend and low risk for causing serious physical harm and imminent violence.
- **Recommendations:**
 - Mr. Ramirez will be deported to Mexico and a warrant will be put out for him if he returns to the United States.
- **Next Action:**
 - Release to ICE for deportation to Mexico.
