DECISION AND REASONS

NAME: ANSPAUGH, Gregory
DOC #: 247032
FACILITY: Stafford Creek Corrections Center – SCCC

This matter came before the above named Board Members of the Indeterminate Sentence Review Board (ISRB or the Board) for a .100 hearing in accordance with RCW 9.95.100. In preparation for the hearing, the Board reviewed Mr. Anspaugh's ISRB file. Mr. Anspaugh was offered legal representation and Mr. Anspaugh indicated he was prepared to proceed without an attorney. Testimony was provided by Department of Corrections (DOC) Classification Counselor (CC) Kendra Wakefield and Psychological Associate (PA) Jack Luadzars, Ph.D.

The sentencing Judge recommended Mr. Anspaugh not be released in his natural lifetime and the Prosecutor recommended life without parole.

LAST BOARD DECISION:

Mr. Anspaugh was last seen by the Board on September 29, 2015 for a .100 Hearing. He was determined not parolable and the Board added 48 months to his minimum term. The Board recommended he reapply for SOTAP and participate in T4C if eligible.

CURRENT BOARD DECISION:

Based on the requirements of RCW 9.95.009(3) and RCW 9.95.100 and the totality of evidence and information considered by the Board, the Board finds that Mr. Anspaugh is not parolable and adds 48 months to his minimum term.

NEXT ACTION:

Schedule a .100 hearing 120 days prior to his new PERD and a new psychological evaluation will be needed.

REASONS FOR DECISION:

This was a deferred decision following a full Board discussion, using a structured decision-making framework that takes into consideration; the statistical estimate of risk, criminal history, parole/release history, ability to control behavior, responsivity to programming, demonstrated offender change, release planning, discordant information, and other case specific factors. Based on the requirements of RCW 9.95.100, the Board finds Mr. Anspaugh not paroleable for the following reasons:

- **Since his last Board hearing, Mr. Anspaugh has been involved in risk related infraction behavior which includes sexual elements and threats of violence, for which he takes no responsibility.**
- **Mr. Anspaugh had mixed results from treatment as indicated in the SOTAP Treatment Summary, most notably, "Mr. Anspaugh engaged in the victim role throughout treatment".**
- **The most recent psychological evaluation, completed on June 8, 2015 by Dr. Zeisler assesses him to be a High risk for future violence and serious physical harm.**

Recommendations:

The Board would like to see Mr. Anspaugh participate in the T4C program, apply for SOTAP aftercare, Bridges to Life, and any other programming that would provide Mr. Anspaugh with the skills he will need to utilize outside of prison.

JURISDICTION:

Gregory Anspaugh is under the jurisdiction of the Board on an April 13, 1982 conviction in King County Cause # 81-1-04024-8 for Attempted Murder in the First Degree While Armed with a Deadly Weapon. The time start is December 7, 1983. The minimum term was set at 360 months (90 month mandatory) aggravated up from a Sentencing Reform Act (SRA) range of 195 to 270 months. The maximum term is Life. Mr. Anspaugh has served approximately 471 months in prison and 0 days of jail time.

OFFENSE DESCRIPTION:

According to file materials, on December 30, 1981, at his age of 27, and while on escape from work release, Mr. Anspaugh raped and attempted to murder a 30-year old woman. The two met at a tavern and later went on a date to dinner and a movie. After the movie, Mr. Anspaugh and the victim went to her residence, where they drank and listened to music. He struck her over the head with a heavy object and raped her twice, then stabbed her multiple times and attempted to smother her. Before he left the residence, Mr. Anspaugh set fire to the bed, stole the victim's car, and fled. The victim, who was feigning death, managed to crawl out and called for help.

PRIOR CRIMINAL / RISK RELATED CONDUCT:

As to King County Cause #73012: According to file materials, on April 7, 1975, Mr. Anspaugh raped a 19-year old woman, using a knife to threaten her. He received probation on the condition that he participate in the Sexual Psychopath program at Western State Hospital (WSH). The court ultimately revoked his probation in 1979 and he was sent to prison on the Assault Second Cause.

As to King County Cause #82-1-00047-3: Mr. Anspaugh escaped from Reynolds Work Release, and while on escape, he committed the index offense in 1981.

PROGRESS/BEHAVIOR SINCE LAST HEARING:

Mr. Anspaugh has had three serious infractions since his last Board hearing in 2015. One infraction included him making threats against another inmate, another was sexual harassment

in which he was openly masturbating in view of DOC staff, and the third was within a short period of time prior to this hearing in which he was in possession of a disc containing a variety of pornographic images. During today's hearing, he admitted to assisting other offenders in accessing DOC computer systems, with their purpose being to distribute the pornography to other offenders. Mr. Anspaugh has completed SOTAP since his last Board hearing, though his treatment summary reflected marginal progress in several treatment areas.

CC Wakefield provided a summary of programming, behavior and other relevant activities for Mr. Anspaugh. She stated that Mr. Anspaugh has three serious infractions since his last hearing which all appear to be risk related to include threats/violence and sexual elements. CC Wakfield indicated that he does have some community support from his daughter and his brother.

Mr. Anspaugh was asked to provide his version of his serious infractions. In his descriptions he accepted very little responsibility and portrayed himself as a victim of circumstance, a theme that appears in his SOTAP summary as well. Mr. Anspaugh went on to explain what a "burden" it is to be in prison and under the Parole Board, which is the reason behind much of his infraction behavior. He did not accept responsibility for his circumstances to include his last infraction that resulted in his transfer from Airway Heights Corrections Center. He stated that he has developed skills that he believes prepares him for release and could describe his high risks and some interventions that he learned in SOTAP.

PA Luadzers discussed his work with Mr. Anspaugh and indicated he has completed an initial intake with Mr. Anspaugh. He stated he expects he will continue to see Mr. Anspaugh and that he is not taking mental health medications at this time.
