- An updated prosecutor recommendation was not received.

- Mr. Anspaugh was seen for a .100 hearing at the Stafford Creek Corrections Center on July 17, 2018.

- **Summary Discussion**
Mr. Patnode presented this case.

Mr. Anspaugh is under the jurisdiction of the Board in King County Cause 81-1-04024-8 for Attempted Murder in the First Degree. He was on escape from work Release when he committed this crime.

Mr. Anspaugh has also been convicted of Assault in the Second Degree in King County Cause 73012 and Escape 1 in King County Cause 82-1-00047-3. Both causes have reached their statutory maximum.

The crime involved Mr. Anspaugh raping and attempting to murder a women with whom he went on a date. The crime occurred at the victim's residence where they went after the date. The victim feigned death and was able to crawl out and call for help after Mr. Anspaugh set fire to her residence. Mr. Anspaugh was 27 years old when the crime occurred. He is currently 64 years of age.

Risk assessment scores rate him at a high risk for future violence.

Mr. Anspaugh has had three major infractions since his last hearing to include threatening other inmates, possessing pornography and sexual harassment of Department of Corrections (DOC) staff.

Mr. Anspaugh completed the Sex Offender Treatment and Assessment Program (SOTAP) with a marginal performance.

Mr. Anspaugh has little to no community support.

- **Decision**

Not parolable. Add 48 months to his minimum term.

- **Reasons:**

- Since his last Board hearing, Mr. Anspaugh has been involved in risk related infraction behavior to include sexual elements and threats of violence, for which he takes no responsibility.
- He has not completed all the offender change programming as requested by the Board at his last hearing.
- The most recent psychological evaluation, completed on June 8, 2015 by Dr. Zeisler assesses him to be a High risk for future violence and serious physical harm.

- **Next Action:** Schedule .100 Hearing 120 days prior to his parole eligibility review date (PERD).

Recommendations: The Board would like to see Mr. Anspaugh participate in Thinking for a Change, apply for SOTAP aftercare and participate in Bridges to Life.
