- An updated prosecutor recommendation was not received.

- Mr. Parejo was seen for a .100 hearing at the Monroe Correctional Complex – Twin Rivers Unit on July 10, 2018.

- **Summary Discussion**
Mrs. Ramsdell-Gilkey presented this case.

Mr. Parejo is under the jurisdiction of the Board in King County Cause 84565 for Rape in the First Degree and Kidnapping in the First Degree. He received a Habitual Criminal finding on this cause

Mr. Parejo has a conviction in Clallam County Cause 4028 for Attempted Rape which has reached its statutory maximum.

The crime involved an unknown couple picking up Mr. Parejo as he was hitchhiking. He abducted the couple at gunpoint and raped the woman over

several hours. A police officer came upon the vehicle and Mr. Parejo ran leaving his wallet and ID behind. He was on escape status from the Washington State Penitentiary at the time. Mr. Parejo was 28 years old at the time of the crime and he is currently 68 years old.

Risk assessment scores rate him at an overall moderate high risk for re-offense.

Mr. Parejo has had no serious infractions since 2003.

Mr. Parejo has completed all available programming to include Making it Work as well as receiving a Certificate of Proficiency for his work with Correctional industries. He also keeps himself busy with hobbies including beadwork.

He has some support in the community.

- **Decision**
Conditionally parolable. Add 36 months to his minimum to transition.
- **Reasons:**
 - No serious infractions since 2003
 - Good work participation in the CI Kitchen
 - Positive influence on the living unit
 - Completion of SOTAP and all Aftercare available
 - Recent Forensic Psych. Evaluation indicating he does not meet the criteria for Sexually Violent Predator
- **Next Action:** Schedule .100 Hearing 120 days prior to his parole eligibility review date (PERD).

Recommendations: Remain infraction free and work on a detailed release plan which includes a plan for remaining clean and sober. The Board would like Mr. Parejo to complete Bridges to Life if it is available, and move to a camp setting.
