- An updated prosecutor recommendation was received recommending no release.

- Mr. Krueger was seen on July 31, 2019 at the Airway Heights Corrections Center for a .100 hearing.

- **Summary Discussion**
Mrs. Ramsdell-Gilkey presented this case.

The Board has jurisdiction in this case for Murder in the Second Degree in Pend Oreille County Cause 7491.

He has previous convictions in Thurston County Cause 4737 for Carnal Knowledge and in Pend Oreille County for Rape 2. These crimes have reached their statutory maximum.

The crime involved Mr. Krueger meeting a 19 year old unknown female at a bar and convincing her to give him a ride by promising her drugs. During the drive he grabbed the victim and strangled her to death. He left her body in the woods. When her body was discovered she was not wearing a shirt and her pants had been pulled down. Mr. Krueger was on abscond status from supervision when the murder occurred. He was 27 years of age at the time and he is currently 67 years of age.

- In 1979 he was convicted of Rape in the Second Degree in Pend Oreille County in 1979. He was also charged with Assault in the Second Degree in Pierce County which he admits he actually raped the victim. The charges were later dismissed with prejudice due to a speedy trial violation. He was suspected of at least five additional rapes in the states of Washington, Idaho and Alaska during this time.
- In 1973 he committed Soliciting a Minor for Immoral Purposes, two counts in Pierce County and Carnal Knowledge in Thurston County. These crimes occurred in 1973.

Risk assessments show Mr. Krueger to be a high risk to re-offend.

Mr. Krueger's infractions have gone down over the years. His last one was in 2012

Mr. Krueger did not participate in his last two psychological evaluations which were paper reviews. A Forensic Psychological Evaluation (FPE) was completed on him in 2012 showing he did not meet criteria for civil commitment.

Mr. Krueger has admitted after all these years that the murder was sexually motivated and is willing to participate in additional treatment with the Sex Offender Treatment and Assessment Program (SOTAP).

Mr. Krueger works as a Tier Representative. However he has not completed any additional programming since his last hearing. It is hard for the Board to see any real change and it is hard to know if he is any closer to becoming rehabilitated.

Mr. Krueger would like to release to a Veterans Administration Domicile. The Board is not sure if they would take a Level III sex offender and the housing is co-ed which is concerning considering his conviction.

Decision:

The panel recommends he be found not parolable and that 48 months be added to his minimum term.

- **Reasons:**

- Refused to participate in Board requested psychological evaluations in 2016 and 2019.
- Prior arrests and sexual deviancy treatment failed to deter further offending while on parole.
- Sexually offended while participating in an inpatient sexual deviancy program at Western State Hospital.
- Has demonstrated he cannot or will not comply with conditions of supervision while in the community by absconding and by committing new sexual offenses while on abscond status.
- A Forensic Psychological Evaluation completed in 2012 with Mr. Kroger’s participation concluded Mr. Krueger is psychopathic and suffers from a disorder of sexual deviance.
- Mr. Krueger has not been honest with treatment providers regarding the sexual motivation behind the homicide, making it difficult to know if his true risks were being addressed adequately.
- Even after his completion of a third round of sexual deviancy treatment in 2014, concern for his attitudes supportive of rape remained high. These concerns included deviant sexual interests and antisocial orientation. His progress in treatment was described as “adequate”.
- Though recommended at the last Board hearing, Mr. Krueger has failed to participate in any additional offender change programming to address his risks.

- **Recommendations:**

- The Board would like Mr. Krueger to write to the (SOTAP) and request readmission to the program. He should address the sexual component of the homicide that he failed to reveal and address previously while in treatment with them. Mr. Krueger should complete the Redemption program and Thinking for a Change as well, in an attempt to reduce his antisocial and criminal thinking.

- **Next Action:**

Schedule .100 120 days prior to his parole eligibility review date (PERD).
