- An updated prosecutor recommendation was not received.
  
- Mr. Anderson was seen for a redetermination hearing at the Coyote Ridge Corrections Center on September 18, 2018.
  
- **Summary Discussion**  
Ms. Rongen presented this case.

Mr. Anderson is under the jurisdiction of the Board and current serving on Spokane County Cause 79-1-00490-2 for Rape in the First Degree Count V and Robbery in the First Degree Count VI.

Prior to moving to these counts, he served the following:

- Spokane County Cause 79-1-00490-2 Count XI for Robbery; Count XII, XIII XIV and XV for Kidnapping in the First Degree and Count IV for Robbery in the First Degree.

- Benton County Cause 78-025 for Robbery in the First Degree (While Arm With a Deadly Weapon)
  - Benton County Cause 78-054
    - Rape in the First Degree Count I and Robbery in the First Degree Count II both (While Armed with a Deadly Weapon)
    - Kidnapping in the First Degree Count III (While Armed with a Deadly Weapon)
    - Kidnapping in the First Degree Count IV (While Armed with a Deadly Weapon); Unlawful Possession of a Firearm Count V
  - Spokane County Cause 26472 for Robbery in the First Degree Count I (While Armed with a Deadly Weapon) Count I; Assault in the Third Degree Count II and Escape in the Second Degree Count VI. Counts II and VI have reached their statutory maximum.
- The crimes listed above involve a series of robberies, rapes, assaults and kidnappings that occurred over a three month period. Mr. Anderson was 24 years old at the time and is currently 65 years of age.

A psychological evaluation completed by DOC rates Mr. Anderson as a high risk to violently re-offend and a moderate risk to sexually re-offend, however the evaluator acknowledges that further participation in criminogenic targeted programming such as sex offender treatment, will inform Mr. Anderson's more balanced overall risk to recidivate.

Mr. Anderson has had no serious infractions since 2006, and no violent infractions since 1991.

Mr. Anderson has completely turned around since 1991. According to reports, he is a good worker, therapy aide, and is involved with religion. The Board would like him to participate in the Sex Offender Treatment and Assessment Program (SOTAP) as well as chemical dependency and possibly Thinking for a Change (T4C).

Mr. Anderson has been married for 40 years. His wife visits him weekly. He has children and grandchildren that support him. He has also had the same attorney for the last 40 years who has seen a change in him.

The panel found him to be calm, a leader and very religious, but does not use that as an excuse or reason to release him.

- **Decision** – Reduce the minimum term to five years on Spokane County Cause 79-1-00490-2 Counts V and VI.

- **Reasons:**
  - ❖ No serious infractions since 2006, no violent infractions since 1991
  - ❖ Has shown significant efforts towards rehabilitation to include work and helping other inmates
  - ❖ Has served over 40 years in prison
  - ❖ Significant social supports in the community
  
- **Next Action:** Schedule a .100 hearing 120 days prior to his Parole Eligibility Review Date (PERD).

**Recommendations:**

- Be screened for SOTAP
  - Thinking for a Change
  - Chemical Dependency
