- An updated prosecutor recommendation was received for no release.
  
- Mr. Norman was seen for a .100 hearing at the Stafford Creek Correction Center on October 9, 2018.
  
- Mr. Norman is currently under the Board's jurisdiction in Kitsap County Cause 78-1-000035-3 for Murder in the First Degree.
  
- **Summary Discussion**  
Ms. Balmert presented this case.

The crime involved Mr. Norman and two accomplices stealing a car and attempting to dispose of the vehicle. They were pulled over by a deputy sheriff while they were towing the stolen vehicle. Mr. Norman shot and killed the deputy sheriff. He was 20 years old at the time and is currently 62 years of age.

He originally received the death penalty which was found to be unconstitutional, and he was sentenced to Life without the Possibility of Parole. He was resentenced again and placed under the jurisdiction of the Board.

Risk assessment scores rate him as an overall low to moderate risk to re-offend.

Mr. Norman has had no serious infractions during his incarceration.

Mr. Norman currently works as a Food Service Worker and receives superior work evaluations. He has received several certificates and awards and completed Makin' it Work.

Mr. Norman would like to release to his wife whom he has never lived with.

- **Decision**
  - The Board finds Mr. Norman not parolable and adds 90 months to his minimum term.
- **Reasons:**
  - Takes no responsibility for the murder.
  - Mr. Norman's explanation of his part in the murder does not match file material, provoking doubt about his ability to understand criminogenic treatment needs and risk factors.
  - He is not fully rehabilitated and a fit subject for release.
- **Next Action:**
  - Schedule .100 hearing 120 days prior to his parole eligibility review date (PERD). If new information Mr. Norm describes becomes available, the Board may determine to schedule an earlier hearing.

**Recommendations:**

- Mr. Norman should access any offender change programs available such as:
  - Bridges to Life
  - Thinking for a Change
  - Stress/Anger Management
